ALEKS

The chairman of the Department of Mathematics set up an ALEKS course code for students who might be interested in using ALEKS on their own to review basic pre-calculus skills. The **ALEKS PPL** too that the Math Department is using is not setup to be an online self-study course. The PPL has assessments and then learning modules to help students work on their deficiencies, but ALEKS has a more developed product with an e-book and other materials.

Still, some students might find it useful to use the PPL. (This is likely to become the primary screening tool for students entering SDSU and will be used to place students in the appropriate course, probably starting in 2017.) It will cost students \$25 for a 6 month license. They will get 5 assessments with a mandatory minimum of 3 hours in the learning modules in between assessments.

There is NOT any way to get a detailed preview of the product, but students can skim the ALEKS website to get an idea of the topics covered.

The student should go to aleks.com. Click SignUp Enter this course code VKW9P 44M4F

Then it should be fairly clear what to do.
