Liberal Studies majors earn a Bachelor of Arts in Applied Arts and Sciences degree. Each student must pass a senior assessment in LS 498 and must pay the required fee to the Test Office early in the semester. When choosing lower division courses, students should consider prerequisites for specializations.

The Liberal Studies major (listed below) specifies 110 units of the 120 required for graduation. **Elective units** may be used for *foreign language* (if necessary), prerequisites for a credential program, or courses of the student's choice.
