Immigration and Naturalization Cases: Tang v . Bailey
1959-1960

A collection of letters, telegrams and other items. These are not filed chronologically.

Warner (Attorney at Law) re/ search of records for Jimmie Tang, father of Jeanie Tang; letters and affidavits (5/60) re/ citizenship case of Jeanie Tang; copies of letters (5/60) from Wilson re/ information on the Tang case; telegram (6/60) from Verne O. Warner to American Consul General (Hong Kong) re/ Jeanie Tang, aka Jeanie Ong; office note from Wilson (6/24/60) to Passport Office re/ passport application had been submitted by Jeanie Tang; letter (6/15/60) from Verne O. Warner to Wilson re/ Jimmie Tang who is trying to secure the admission of his daughter from Hong Kong; memorandum (7/21) & memo (6/24/60) re/ Jeanie Tang; letter (11/16/60) from Francis G. Knight (Dir., Passport Office, Dept. of State) re/ citizenship case of Jeanie Tang; letter, affidavit, photocopy of State of Arizona Marriage License & city of Los Angeles birth certificate re/ Jimmie Tang & his daughter Jeanie Tang; a letter (9/11/62) from H. F. Landgraf (Attorney at Law) & Wilson's reply (10/22/62) re/ a summation of Mr. Jimmie Tang's efforts to facilitate citizenship for his daughter Jeanie.
