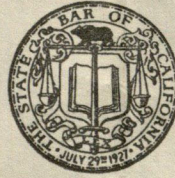

The Committee of Bar Examiners is pleased to inform you that you have passed the Fall 1957 bar examination, and that you will be certified to the Supreme Court for admission to practice law in California and membership in the State Bar.

To be admitted it is necessary for you to appear before the Supreme Court to take the Attorney's Oath of Office. The Court has designated the following times and places at which it will entertain motions for admission and administer the oath.

San Francisco, Wednesday, December 18, 1957

At San Francisco, in the Courtroom, State Building, Civic Center, on Wednesday, December 18, 1957.

Those whose surnames begin with the letters A to K, inclusive, will be administered the oath at 10:00 a.m.

Those whose surnames begin with the letters L to Z, inclusive, will be administered the oath at 2:00 p.m.

You should be present in the Courtroom about fifteen minutes prior to the time scheduled for your admission.

Los Angeles, Tuesday, January 7, 1958

At Los Angeles, in the Courtroom, State Building, Civic Center, on Tuesday, January 7, 1958.

Those whose surnames begin with the letters A to K, inclusive, will be administered the oath at 9:30 a.m.

Those who surnames begin with the letters L to Z, inclusive, will be administered the oath at 2:00 p.m.

You should be present in the Courtroom about fifteen minutes prior to the time scheduled for your admission.

Procedure

To have your name included in the motion to be made at San Francisco on December 18, 1957, fill out and return the enclosed registration card, together with the sum of \$21.00, to reach the San Francisco office of the Committee of Bar Examiners, 2007 Central Tower, 703 Market Street, San Francisco, as soon as possible and in no event later than December 13, 1957.

To have your name included in the motion to be made at Los Angeles on January 7, 1958, fill out and return the enclosed registration card, together with the sum of \$21.00, to reach the Los Angeles office of the Committee of Bar Examiners, 440 Rowan Building, 458 South Spring Street, Los Angeles, as soon as possible and in no event later than December 20, 1957.

Please indicate on the registration card the date upon which you desire to appear and take the oath.

Your Name

Your name must be entered on the registration and admission cards exactly as it appears on the envelope transmitting this notice to you. This is the way you stated in your application that you wanted your name to appear on your Certificate of Admission, and the Supreme Court has already been advised thereof.

The requested sum of \$21.00 is to cover your fee as an active member of the State Bar for the year 1958 (\$20.00) and the Supreme Court fee for admission (\$1.00). Checks should be payable to The State Bar of California.

Retain the enclosed pink and white cards until the time of your admission, when they are to be delivered to the Clerk of the Supreme Court. Fill out both of these cards in advance, but do not sign the white card until directed to do so by the Clerk. Please print your name except where a signature is indicated.

Admittees in Military Service


If you are on active duty in the armed forces on admission day the State Bar fee will be waived. However, it will still be necessary to pay the Supreme Court fee of \$1.00. If you are on active duty, send in your registration card together with the sum of \$1.00 and a written statement under oath that you are on active duty, giving the branch of service, your serial number, rank, and name of unit to which attached.

If your military duties make it impossible for you to appear before the Supreme Court on admission day, notify the Committee in writing of such fact when transmitting your registration card and fee. The Committee will then recommend your admission in absentia and ask the Court to grant you permission to take the Attorney's Oath before a competent official where you are stationed. Further details as to the procedure to be followed will be given you if and after the Court grants such permission. Please state in your letter whether you will appear or whether you wish to be admitted in absentia.

Induction in the U.S. District Courts

The Conference of Junior Bar Members in Los Angeles and the Barristers' Club in San Francisco will sponsor your admission to the Bar of the respective U.S. District Court immediately following your admission to the state courts. Announcements will be made by representatives of those two organizations at the time of the admission ceremonies in the State Supreme Court of the time and place of the induction in the district courts and of the procedure you should follow.
