The African Arts Committee requests the honor of your presence and service as an Elder of San Diego in the first RITES DE PASSAGE celebration from 3 to 5 o'clock, Sunday afternoon, April 26, 1981, in Copley Auditorium at the San Diego Museum of Art, Balboa Park.

RITES DE PASSAGE is an initiation of the coming of age of young people incorporating African art forms of sculpture, apparel, music and dance. It will be the culmination of a 13 week study of African life and culture by 22 boys and girls from 12 to 15 years of age.
