Gilliam after graduating from San Diego State University with a Bachelors of Arts in 1953 earned his Juris Doctorate in 1957 from the University of California, Hastings College of the Law and returned to share his knowledge and experience as the Head of the Trial Practice Department of Western State University Law School in San Diego beginning in 1969 to the present; and

WHEREAS, Earl B. Gilliam became the first African American on the Municipal Court in San Diego and was the only African American on the Superior Court during his tenure there; and


