### FIRST NEGRO BANK GUARD RETIRES

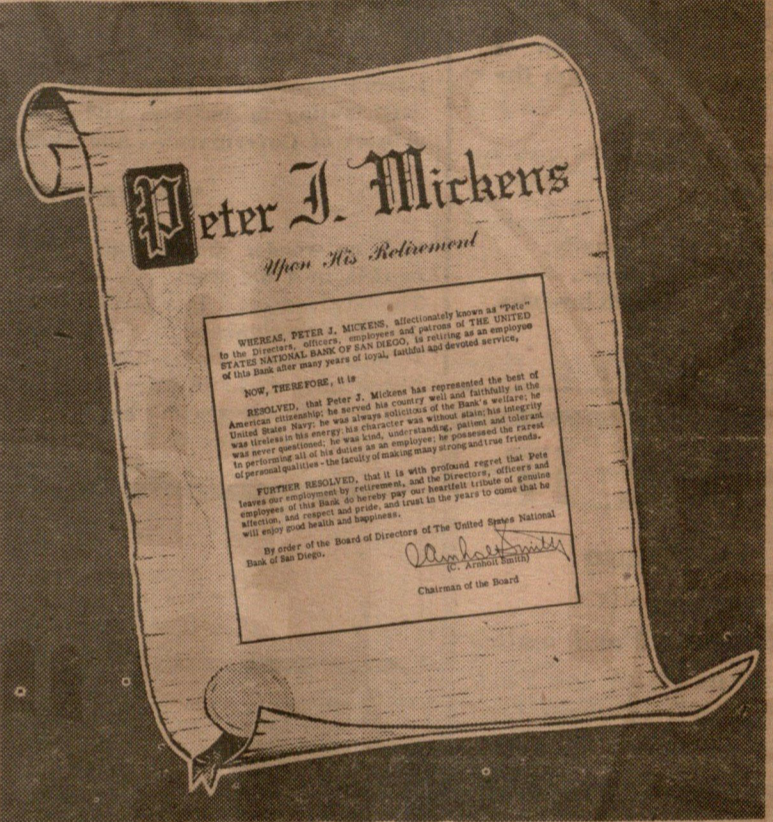
Mr. Mickens, started working as a Janitor at the U. S. National in August 1933, after three years in that capacity, he was advanced to a Guard, he was the first Negro for fifteen years, to hold such job at a Bank, he is also responsible for nine Negro people to be employed at the Main Bldg. of the United States National Bank here.

Mr. Mickens, also retired from the USN. as a Chief Petty Officer, after Twenty-four years active duty, he went around the world several times, under the administration of the late President, Teddy Roosevelt.

He came to San Diego in 1921, from Boston, Mass. where he married the former Miss. Cynthia Green, they have no children, both are members of the Bethel A. M. E. Church, Rev. C. Wayne Love, is the Pastor.

### Scroll Presented For Valuable Service

His retirement began on October 1st 1957.

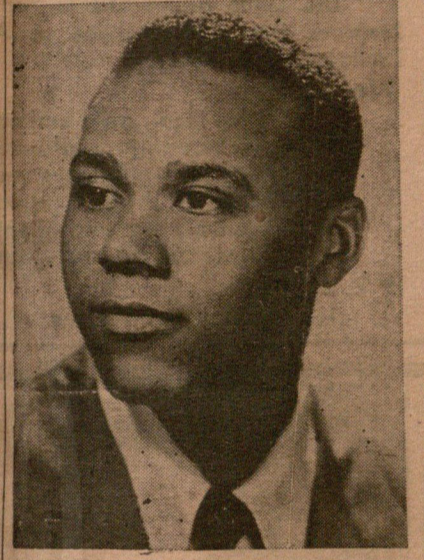

## The Light House Stand:

The Light House stands for complete integration of Negroes into every phase of American life through the Democratic processes.

We favor:

1. FEPC on local, state and national levels.
2. Decent housing for all Americans.
3. Representation in Government.
4. Adequate old age pensions and social security.
5. Collective bargaining rights for all workmen.
6. Development and encouragement of Negro business.

We oppose:

1. Jim Crow in all forms.

Invested in Churches, distributed in Buildings, Building Funds—and the new phase—Credit Unions. The ministers in the community are the most politically and commercially astute members of the community. The Churches have almost complete control of the majority of the residents. Generally the Ministers are not civic minded. The ministers are well organized—They are excellent business men.

### ORGANIZATIONALLY

The Negro does not have a single militant Negro organization which carries on a day-to-day fight for their rights. The Negro Press takes the lead in fighting for Negro rights, almost to its detriment. Other minority groups fight for Negro rights or the fight. The Negro is organizing—has strong political potentials. Becoming conscious of political power via the vote—showing a growing distrust of the so-called—white liberal—Voted Republican in 1956.

### POLITICALLY

The Negro is organizing—has strong political potentials.

### SPENDS OVER \$100,750,000 YEARLY

On Foods—Not one single Negro-Owned Super Market—Nor is there a single super market with a Negro Manager in the community—

Negro men, with a few exceptions, show little interest in owning and operating their own business. They are almost entirely dependent upon others to take responsibility of business—They discuss integration—not realizing that integration will come only through participating in business and commerce—thus learning the true policies of Government—and “know how.”

Last Tuesday, I was invited to a meeting at the Lafayette Hotel, by the National Jewish Council, to hear a lecture on Integration.

The Book Review by a Professor from State College was interesting, because it dealt with a problem very close to my heart; in fact, more than integration. That is our economic Plight, there were four of us colored, three men and one woman.

It was a nice bunch of ladies, and the question that was ask, showed their attitude was favorable to our cause, but the Professor that gave the lecture, I think he was from North Carolina, as he often referred to the University of North Carolina, and his speech was the kind that you would expect from anyone from any part of the South, the one that would favor the law to punish a person for Cruelty to Animals, but would be against any law that would give equal rights and opportunity to all Citizens, his lecture showed him to be in favor of punishing any Negro, if he fail to answer the call, if he was called into Service or to pay his Taxes.

But, on the other hand he inferred that you could not make people like you, and the use of Toops was a mistake at Little Rock, but he never mention Governor Fabus calling out the National Guards, to keep Nine Negroes out of School, when One Policeman could have done the job, he never said a word about obeying the law is the first duty of a Citizen, I think he and Governor Faubus has the same idea; Prejudice, both has their Share in high places, where it does the most harm.

## Klan Leader Gets 20-Year Sentence

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Nov.—Bart A. Floyd, a Ku Klux Klan lieutenant, was found guilty of mayhem today in the mutilation of a Negro Sept. 1. He was sentenced to the maximum 20 years imprisonment.

Floyd, the second member of the Klan group to be tried in the case, was accused of performing the mutilation and tossing turpentine on the wound. He was also the second to receive the maximum penalty in connection with the crime.

A jury last week found Joe P. Pritchett, the Klan leader, guilty of maynem. He was sentenced to 20 years. Four other Klansmen await trial in the case.

## Army Switches Negroes Wed To Germans

WASHINGTON, Nov. 6.—The Army today said all Negroes in the 2nd Armored Division known to have married white women in Germany will have transferred to other units before the division reaches its new station in Texas early next month.

Advance elements of the 2nd Armored are scheduled to leave Germany late this month for Ft. Hood, Tex, and will be followed soon afterward by the remainder of the division. The 4th Armored Division, now at Ft. Hood, will replace the 2nd in Germany.

The Army was confronted with the problem of mixed marriages after it decided to assign the 2nd Armored to the Texas post. Negro soldiers who had married German women were told the state of Texas does not recognize marriages between Negroes and

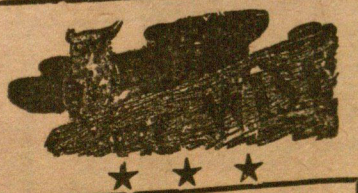

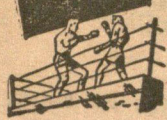

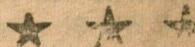
To my Readers:

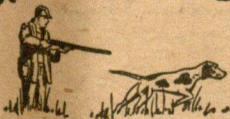

Rosemary, a freshman at PCC, majoring in elementary education, is 18 years old.

Second girl is Frances Irene Pitts, also 18 and an elementary education major, of 489 Atchison st., Pasadena.

Frances is the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. R. Pitts, both educators, and the family has been here less than a year from Fort Valley, Ga. Frances formerly attended Talladega college.

Dr. Pitts is a professor of mathematics at Los Angeles City College and Mrs. Pitts a College teacher in an Altadena elementary school.

Her arrest had been ordered by the Little Rock City Council for violation of a new city ordinance which required certain organizations to make public their confidential files.

Mrs. Bates was released on \$300 bond.

She was met at the city airport by her attorneys and driven immediately to the police station.

While in New York she addressed several NAACP meetings and earlier today visited with New York Gov. Harriman at his New York City home.

The council voted unanimously Thursday night to order the arrest of all NAACP officials who could be found in the city.

Only two officers of the association are known. They are Mrs. Bates and the Rev. J. C. Crenshaw, 74, pastor of a Little Rock Baptist Church.

Crenshaw surrendered to police yesterday and was released on \$300 bond.

**Probation Granted In Rape Case**

William Henry Barnslater, 20, of 312 26th St., a laborer, was placed on five years' probation in Superior Court for statutory rape of a 13-year-old girl.

As a condition of probation, Barnslater was ordered to reimburse the county Welfare Department for any expenses incurred in the hospitalization of the girl, who is pregnant. He also was ordered to pay \$35 a month for support of the child.

Barnslater had pleaded guilty of the rape charge. He told the probation department he was in love with the girl

**Army Switches  
Negroes Wed  
To Germans**

WASHINGTON, Nov.— The Army today said all Negroes in the 2nd Armored Division known to have married white women in Germany will have transferred to other units before the division reaches its new station in Texas early next month.

Advance elements of the 2nd Armored are scheduled to leave Germany late this month for Ft. Hood, Tex., and will be followed soon afterward by the remainder of the division. The 4th Armored Division, now at Ft. Hood, will replace the 2nd in Germany.

The Army was confronted with the problem of mixed marriages after it decided to assign the 2nd Armored to the Texas post. Negro soldiers who had married German women were told the state of Texas does not recognize marriages between Negroes and whites.

**Civil Rights  
Panel Named  
By President**

WASHINGTON, Nov.— President Eisenhower today set up a six-man Civil Rights Commission, established by Congress this year, and named Stanley F. Reed, a former Supreme Court associate justice, as its chairman.

The commission was created after a prolonged controversy in the Senate which finally ended in compromise.

Its purpose is to look into civil rights complaints and make recommendations. It is without power to enforce equal protection for Negroes and other minorities.

Besides Reed, the President appointed these other members:

John A. Hannah, former assistant secretary of defense and who is a member of the faculty of Michigan State University; Former Gov. Battle of Virginia; J. Ernest Wilkins, a New Hampshire Negro and former assistant secretary of labor.

Ranch People who spend most of their time in Montana, and spends about three or four months of the year in La Jolla.

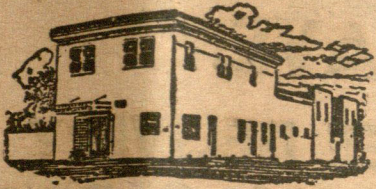

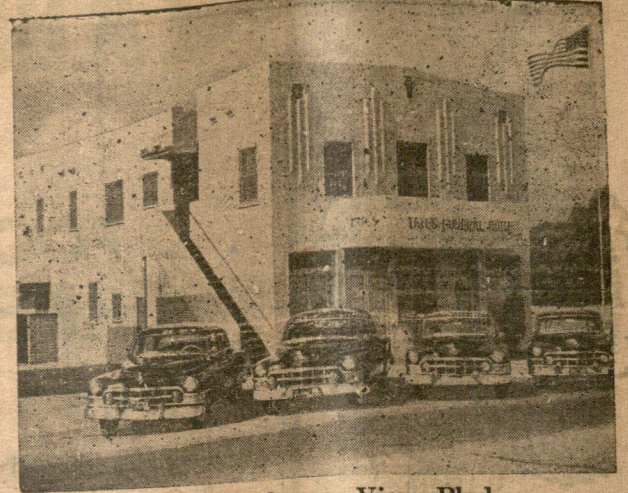

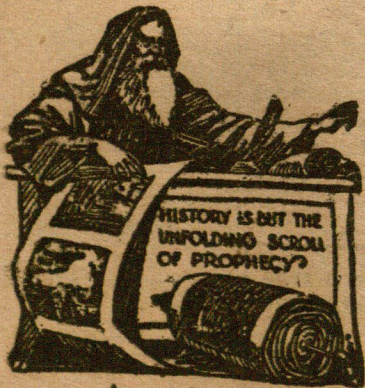
