AS I GREW OLDER

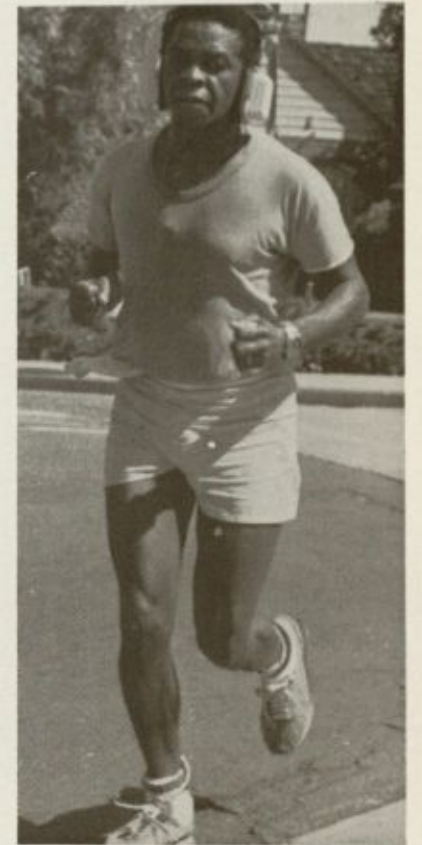
It was a long time ago.

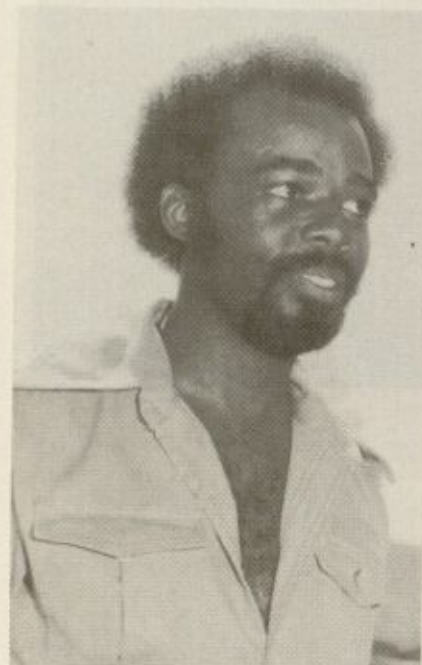

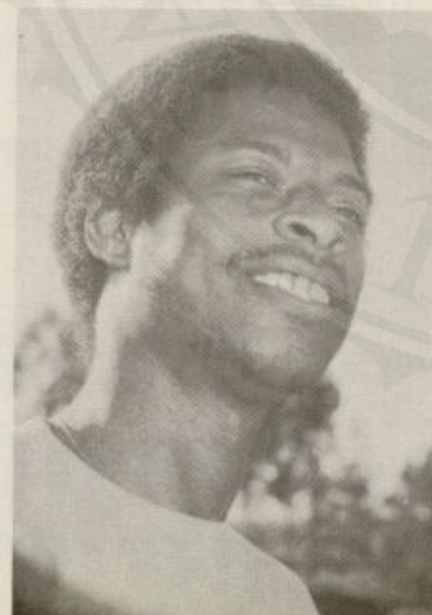

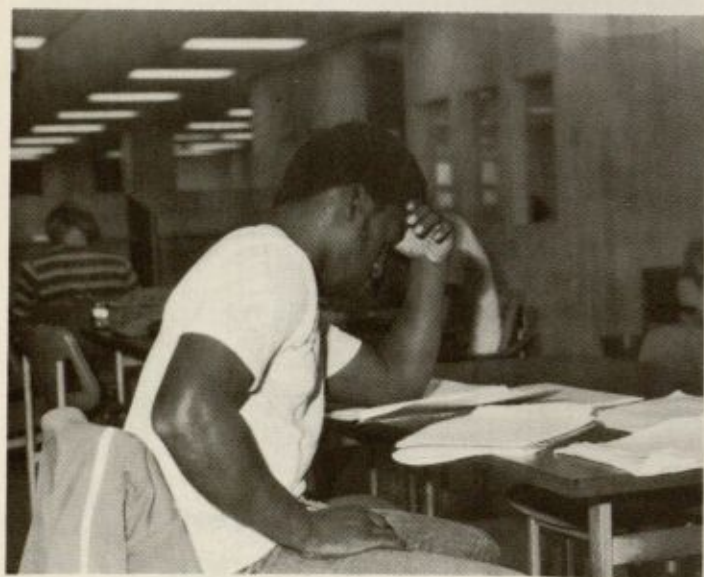

CLAUDE GILBERT Aztec Head Coach

Claude Gilbert enters his fifth year as head football coach at San Diego State University after posting an outstanding 35-7-2 mark in his first four seasons.

Gilbert took over the Aztec job in 1973 after serving for six years on the San Diego State staff under Don Coryell. Gilbert coached the offensive line for two seasons and was defensive co-ordinator for four years under Coryell.

Gilbert played his collegiate ball at San Jose State where he was a fullback and flanker. He was the Spartan's team captain as a senior in 1958.

Claude went right into coaching following graduation from college and was an assistant coach at Tulare High School in 1959. In 1960 he got the head job at Shafter High School and in three years guided the Generals to a 24-3-0 record and two league titles.

Bakersfield College was the next stop for Gilbert where he was a defensive coach for the Renegades from 1963 to 1965. From there Claude landed the head job at Southwestern College in Chula Vista.

JC transfer who comes to the Aztecs from Chabot College in Hayward ... gained 650 yards as a freshman, but was hurt much of last season ... won the California State heavyweight wrestling title last year and was 33-0 in matches ... prepped at Mt. Eden High School in Hayward where he wrestled and played football ... born March 19, 1957 in Odessa, Texas, but lives now in Hayward ... single ... P.E. major.



44 WARD, TERRELL—Defensive Back—5-8—185—20—Jr.

Safety candidate who transferred to San Diego State from City College of San Francisco ... was All-Golden Gate Conference two seasons while at CCSF in football and recorded times of 21.5 in 220 and 9.5 in the 100 in track ... prepped at Wilson High School in San Francisco where he was all-league ... born November 17, 1957 in San Francisco and still calls it home ... single.



68 INGE, PETE—Offensive Guard—6-0—263—20—So.

Walked-on to the Aztec team and immediately earned a starting spot last year ... played in 10 games last season as a freshman and started all of them ... came to the Aztecs from St. Mary's High School in Stockton where he was all-league two seasons and All-Northern California ... also lettered two years in baseball ... born September 15, 1957 in Mobile.



28 JACKSON, TERRY—Defensive Back—5-10—185—21—Sr.

Two year letterman who started at strong safety last season when he was healthy ... missed four games with injuries, but still managed 19 tackles, 12 assists and two interceptions ... had 18 tackles, 10 assists and three interceptions as a sophomore ... came to the Aztecs after one year at San Diego City College ... prepped at St. Augustine High School in San Diego where he played football and basketball ... brother Monte played at San Diego State and is an All-Pro DB with the L.A. Rams ... born December 9, 1955 in Sherman, Texas, but lives in San Diego now.



25 JOHNSON, TIM—Wide Receiver—5-9—170—22—Sr.

Junior college transfer who caught 39 passes for 878 yards, eight TD's and a state leading 22.5 average per catch at Fresno City College ... was All-Valley Conference in football and placed third in the conference triple jump finals with a leap of 47-8 ... prepped at Fresno High School, but didn't play football ... born February 12, 1955 in Madera.



87 GLENN, DONNIE—Tight End—6-1—210—21—Jr.

New player who comes to the Aztecs from Fresno City College ... caught 35 passes for 592 yards and three TD's last year at FCC and was All-Valley Conference and honorable mention All-State ... prepped at Central Union High School in Fresno where he was all-league as a tight end and linebacker ... born September 2, 1956 in Fresno and still lives there ... single ... business management major.



1 PEARSON, DENNIS—Wide Receiver—5-11½—180—22—Sr.

Redshirted last year at SDSU after playing three seasons at Washington State ... caught 21 passes for 291 yards two seasons ago for the Cougars ... prepped at Monterey High School where he was all-league as a running back and defensive back ... also lettered in basketball and track ... born February 9, 1955 in Seaside and still calls it home ... single ... business major.



92 RICHARDSON, RICK—Def. End—6-2½—234—21—Jr.

Potential starter who comes to the Aztecs from San Diego City College ... was an All-Mission Conference selection last season for the Knights ... went to Lincoln High School in San Diego where he was All-Eastern League and a 1st team All-CIF selection ... born December 20, 1955 in San Diego and still calls it home.



39 MARTIN, SALADIN—Defensive Back—5-11½—175—21—Jr.

Redshirted last season at San Diego State after a fine career at San Diego City College ... was All-Mission Conference at SDCC and tied for second in the State in interceptions with eight for 131 yards and a TD ... prepped at Lincoln High School in San Diego where he was All-Eastern League ... born January 17, 1958 in San Diego and still lives here ... single ... business major.



37 WILLIAMS, HENRY—Defensive Back—5-10—191—20—Jr.

Top junior college recruit from Hartnell College in Salinas ... was All-Coast Conference, 1st team All-State and honorable mention All-America ... played tailback for four games last year and then intercepted eight passes in the final five games of the season ... also lettered in track and runs 9.8 in the 100 ... prepped at Jefferson High School in Los Angeles where he was All-City ... born December 2, 1956 in Greenborough, Alabama, but lives now in Los Angeles ... single ... industrial arts major.



76 YARBROUGH, DARRYL—Offensive Tackle—6-0—250—18—Fr.

Local high school recruit from Morse ... was All-Eastern League two years as well as All-CIF ... was also the Student Body President at Morse ... born August 8, 1959 in San Diego and still calls it home ... single.



36 CREWS, CHARLIE—Running Back—6-0—180—19—So.

Carried the ball 40 time for 101 yards and two TD's for the Aztecs as a freshman last season ... gained 71 yards on 21 carries against Fullerton State ... came to the Aztecs from Morse High School in San Diego where he gained 1030 yards as a senior and was All-CIF 1st team as both a running back and a defensive back ... triple jumped 46-6 in high school ... born January 6, 1958 in San Diego and still lives here.



60 DOUGLASS, MIKE—Linebacker—6-0—216—21—Jr.

Outstanding prospect who comes to San Diego State from Los Angeles City College ... was All-Southern California Conference last year at LACC as an inside linebacker, but will move outside at track ... also lettered in track at LACC ... set several national intramural track records at San Diego State in the spring ... prepped at Jordan High School in Los Angeles where he was All-Eastern League for three years ... also lettered three years in track and three in basketball ... was class president his senior year in high school and an honor student ... born March 15, 1955 in St. Louis, Missouri, but lives now in Los Angeles ... single.



18 WHITE, TERRY—Wide Receiver—6-0—184—22—Sr.

First game injury forced Terry to redshirt last season ... caught two passes for 25 yards in first game before going out with injury ... caught one pass for eight yards as a junior ... came to the Aztecs from Walla Walla Community College where he was all-conference and a JC All-America ... prepped at Las Vegas High School in Nevada where he was all-league ... also played basketball ... brother Lee played fullback for several NFL teams ... born April 4, 1954 in Las Vegas and still calls it home ... single ... recreation major.



31 STOKES, BILL—Running Back—6-1½—204—24—Senior

Transfer from University of Oregon where he carried the ball 10 times for 60 yards on the Duck IV team ... attended San Bernardino College where he lettered as a running back ... also ran track and has run the 100-yard dash in 9.3 and the 220 in 20.5 ... prepped at Weiquakin High School in Newark, New Jersey where he was all-city ... also was New Jersey State 60-yard dash champion ... born July 27, 1951 in Rahway, New Jersey, but calls Newark home now ... married (Shirley).



19 FERGERSON, DUKE—Wide Receiver—6-0½—193—21—Senior

Transfer who comes to the Aztecs from Washington State ... caught 10 passes for 123 yards and a TD and returned 11 kickoffs for 245 yards last year at Washington State ... had a 43 yard pass reception and a 45 yard kickoff return ... also ran track at WSU and is a 9.6 sprinter ... attended Merced College where he was all-conference and All-State ... prepped at Merced Union High School where he lettered three years as a running back ... also ran track and played basketball ... born April 21, 1954 in Boise, Idaho, but lives now in Merced ... single ... political science major ... brother of former Aztec receiver Nate Ferguson.



58 ORANGE, RICKEY—Linebacker—5-11½—215—21—Sr.

Returning letterman who recorded 11 tackles and four assists last season ... came to the Aztecs from Los Angeles Harbor College where he was All-South Coast Conference two seasons and won the conference javelin in track ... prepped at Gardena High School where he was all-league ... born June 9, 1956 in Oakland and still calls it home ... single.



12 JACKSON, TONY—Wide Receiver—6-3—200—20—Junior

Tall, rangy wide receiver from Fresno City College ... was All-Valley Conference for two years ... caught 22 passes for 528 yards and five scores for a running team ... prepped at Fowler High School where he was All-East Sierra League ... has played basketball, baseball and ran track ... born September 5, 1955 in Fresno, but calls Fowler home now ... single.



23 MATHIS, KEN—Defensive Back—5-8½—165—22—Sr.

Letterman who led the Aztecs in punt and kickoff returns last season ... returned 12 kickoffs 231 yards and 22 punts 118 yards ... came to SDSU from Los Angeles City College where he was All-Southern California Conference ... is a 9.6 sprinter and won the conference 100 title in JC ... played high school ball at Dorsey in Los Angeles where he was all-league as a running back ... born July 16, 1955 in Cleveland, Ohio, but calls Los Angeles home now ... single ... sociology major.



45 THOMAS, JOE—Defensive Back—6-0—170—20—So.

Came to the Aztecs after one year at San Jose City College ... was All-Golden Gate Conference while at SJCC, intercepting seven passes ... prepped at Mt. Eden High School in Hayward where he was all-league ... born June 29, 1957 in Berkeley, but lives now in Hayward ... single.



34 BROWN, OLLIE—Running Back—5-10—185—20—Junior

Two year letterman who appears ready to come into his own this year ... carried the ball only nine times as a freshman and had 92 yards on 20 carries last year ... broke one run for 34 yards last season ... came to the Aztecs from Morse High School in San Diego where he lettered three years and was All-Eastern League two years ... also played basketball and was all-league and All-CIF ... born February 22, 1955 in Coronado, but calls San Diego home now ... single.



38 MARSHALL, GARY—Def. Back—5-7½—180—22—Sr.



Three year letterman who started several games last year at cornerback ... had 26 tackles, 11 assists, recovered three fumbles and intercepted three passes ... had 21 tackles and 22 assists as a sophomore and 17 tackles and 16 assists as a freshman ... has three year totals of 64 tackles and 49 assists as an Aztec ... came to San Diego State from Morningside High School in Inglewood where he lettered two years ... born April 29, 1954 in Houston, Texas, but lives now in Inglewood.

20 COX, BOBBY—Defensive Back—6-1—205—22—Junior



Outstanding newcomer from Citrus College where he played strong safety ... was All-Mission Conference, 1st team All-State and 2nd team All-America at Citrus ... returned an interception 98 yards for a score and a kickoff 101 yards for another score in JC last year ... prepped at Monrovia High School where he was all-league ... also played baseball at Monrovia ... born January 26, 1953 in Las Vegas, Nevada, but calls Monrovia home now ... single ... recreation major.

32 HENRY, ROB—Running Back—6-0—210—20—Junior



New fullback who comes to the Aztecs from Merced College ... was all-conference as a freshman when he gained over 700 yards ... gained 560 yards on 112 carries in five games last year before an injury forced him out of action ... prepped at Billy Mitchell High School in Colorado Springs, Colorado where he was all-league in football ... also wrestled at 185 pounds and won the district championship two years ... born July 28, 1955 in Bohmholder, Germany, but calls Colorado Springs home now ... single ... psychology major.

41 HINTON, KEN—Defensive Back—5-8½—165—20—Junior



Highly regarded corner back who comes to San Diego State from El Camino College ... was All-Metropolitan Conference, All-State and honorable mention All-America in JC ... prepped at Gardena High School where he was All-Marine League and All-City ... born July 2, 1955 in Los Angeles, but lives in Gardena now ... single ... public administration major.

97 CHAMBLISS, PHIL—Defensive End—6-3—257—20—Jr.



One of San Diego State's top JC recruits ... played the last two seasons at MiraCosta College in Oceanside and was All-Desert Conference two years and 1st team All-State and honorable mention All-America as a sophomore ... also lettered in track, throwing the discus 158-5 ... prepped at Fletcher High School in Neptune Beach, Florida where he was a prep All-America in football ... brother Chris plays first base for the New York Yankees and father is a Navy Chaplain ... born February 25, 1957 in Great Lakes, Illinois, but lives now in Oceanside.

52 WILLIAMS, RAY—Linebacker—5-10—211—21—Junior

1st team junior college All-America who comes to the Aztecs from Fresno City College ... was also All-Valley Conference for the Rams ... led Fresno CC in QB sacks last season from outside linebacker slot ... prepped at Hoover High School in Fresno where he was Player of the Year ... born December 12, 1955 in Atlanta, Georgia, but lives now in Fresno

12 MOORE, JOHNNY—Defensive Back—6-1½—185—19—Fr.



Freshman who redshirted last year at San Diego State ... prepped at Oceanside High School where he was All-Avocado League, 1st team All-CIF and made several All-America teams ... intercepted five passes and returned two for scores and caught 13 passes for four TD's as a receiver ... also runs the 120 HH in 14.6 ... born May 30, 1958 in 29 Palms, but lives now in Oceanside ... single.

DAVID TURNER (22)

Running Back 5-11 207 21 Junior

The San Diego State coaching staff feels they got the best junior college football player in the nation last spring when David (Deacon) Turner decided to become an Aztec. Turner, who comes to the Aztecs from Bakersfield College, was the most prolific runner in California Junior College history. Last year at Bakersfield he gained 1796 yards rushing on 293 carries and scored 19 TD's in 10 games to lead the State in rushing and set a new single season rushing record. He won the rushing title by 434 yards. His best game last season was 314 yards on 41 carries and three TD's against Pierce. As a freshman at Bakersfield Turner gained 1230 yards on 195 carries and scored 10 times. In two years of JC, David racked up 3026 yards rushing to set an alltime California JC mark. He also had 3161 yards all purpose rushing. Among his honors last year were All-Metropolitan Conference, All-State, Player of the Year in California and 1st team JC All-America. As a freshman he was all-conference, All-State and honorable mention All-America. "David should add a super new dimension to our offense," said Aztec coach Claude Gilbert. "He is just so very explosive that it's hard to believe. Coach Gerry Collis and his guys at Bakersfield did a super job with David for two years and I hope we can get him the football enough times to win some games." Turner prepped at Shafter High School where he lettered three years and was All-League and a prep All-America. He also ran track in high school. Shafter is the same high school Gilbert coached early in his career. Turner was born January 2, 1955 in Jackson, Mississippi, but lives now in Buttonwillow.
