'Disservice' to Pupils Blasted **During Conference on Education**

ped unceremoniously into the laps of some 300 principals and other school functionaries this week at Gompers High School.

The charge came during the American Negro Conference which keynoted stimulation of problem solutions, and challenged the disservice being accorded minority groups in connection with the education of their children. Particularly embarrassing was the stated fact, by repetition, that school funds accrue out of the combined taxes of all property owners.

RELATIVE TO the hot issue of scholarship money, Gilliam stated that \$2 million in scholarship funds are available to bright students, but that bright Negro students seldom were informed of their opportunity to apply for funds.

DR. FRANK TAIT of O'-Farrell Junior High, presided at the conference which began Friday. Participants included the Rev. P. H. Gholston, and the Rev. George W. Smith. Panelists were supervised by Ruth Love, and were Opal Jones, Edward Maddox, Arthur J. Williams, James Gilliam and Dumas Robinson. This battery of stalwarts

discussed the gamut of socioeconomic problems which confront the Negro and Mexican child in a much-publicized "affluent society." A breakdown of comment revealed that teacher-attitude was often less than desired, and that the curriculum has not occupied itself in telling, through its history books, the overwhelming contribu-tion of Negroes to the commonwealth of the United States.

Undeniably, James Gilliam did not pull any punches in his attack in defense of the "citizens of America." He underscored the fact that the conference would not be "another display of pretty words and fraternization."

"IT IS TO BE the beginning of affirmative action to ameliorate conditions that are patently disgraceful and harmful to white and black children alike," said Gilliam. "According to the 1960 U.S.

This was the bombshell that James Gilliam, president of San Diego County Census," he said, "one out of Teachers' Association, drop-levery three children in the country was considered to be culturally deprived. Classroom teachers can easily identify various factors which go to show why youngsters do not learn and why they become problems.

Tools Change

Scene were no machine tools excepting looms and grist mills which happened to be run by water power, Men had thousands of different tools, some looking quaint to us, but they were manually operated.

Today the measure of a nation's industrial capacity (or potential) is its ability to produce machine tools.

Most of the things in and about our houses and factories were made by machine tools. There are machine tool peoples: Americans, British, French, Belgians, Germans, Swedes, Russians and Japanese. These produce a large part of the tools on which the world's industry is founded and functions.

MANY MACHINE tools, bulky and expensive, are not familiar to us unless we are in industry, and then we know only those we use. Industry divides tools into two main categories: cutting and forming.

MODERN INDUSTRY has the secret of perpetual reproduction in tools, for machine tools must make other machine tools, which then make machine tools or just machines, like automobiles or refrigerators. The machine tool may be a

lathe or a gear-cutter, or it may drill or stamp or press metal or plastics. Advertisements in trade journals show us these ungainly objects by the hundreds, and their typenames only give us a meager (Continued on Page A-3)

. . . THE RICH grow richer and the poor grow poorer in machine tools. The United States and the nations of western Europe are self-sufficient in tools and have a moderate export, because the backward regions are a thin market, being low in cash and industry.

AS WOULD be expected be made in Niger,

the Japanese, having reached saturation in machine production (electronics or ships), are now turning to machine pean market, and total export is expected to reach \$20 million this year. But Japan has no rivals in the Far East. Here is a vast though scattered market producing almost no machine tools for itself, and the Japanese can easily undersell the West.

For machine tools, the organization of trained technicians, research, raw material supply and markets is an exceedingly slow and complex process, but when any nation can make its own machine tools it is on the way.
