Black Belt Project Revealed

SNCC Opens Local Office For Workers

Extension of the Mississippi Summer Project into what will be known in the future as "The Black Belt Project" was revealed this week by Rogre Barkley of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee.

He observed that SNCC, whose San Diego headquarters will be located at 2622 El Cajon Blvd., is not composed of members in the usual interpretation of the word. SNCC's affiliates are termed workers, and they work for better race relations through education and voter registration programs.

ACTUALLY, the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee was born out of the history-making sit-in movement that erupted across the South in the spring of 1960. At Easter of that year, the first southwide meeting of sit-in leaders was held in Raleigh, N.C.

HERE A TEMPORARY committee to promote communication and coordination of activities among protest groups was set. This committee met monthly during the summer, and office in Atlanta, and at a second conference held there, officially formed the organization.

Participation in the Freedom Rides in 1961 and a growing sense of the depth of fear that shackled most Negroes of the South convinced SNCC leaders that they were on the right

Johnson Favored By Local Voters

Information furnished by the Registrar of Voters reveals that President Johnson received a plurality of votes over Senator Goldwater in recent elections. City of San Diego figures show a preference for Johnson by 112,469 as against 106,422 or a difference in tally of 6,047 votes.

Agency Lifts Ban on Funds

After agreement to abandon their stand on racial discrimination in the resale or rental of property under the Urban Renewal Administration guidelines, the agency has lifted the ban on federal funds to urban renewal projects in California. Defeat of the Rumford Housing Act is being contested hotly in the courts on the grounds that the initiative amendment is unconstitutional.

Chapin Calls For Positive Work Policies

"Equal opportunity has perhaps a different connotation here on the West Coast. Here, the feeling of participation in international affairs is somewhat more acute than that on the East Coast — because of the long and varied involvement of California and the San Diego Bay region with your neighbors across the bosom of the Pacific Ocean," declared Arthur A. Chapin, special assistant to the Secretary of Labor, on the Urban League's observance of Equal Opportunity Day.

Present in the Pavilion Room of the U.S. Grant Hotel were 300 individuals, representative of the merchant class who listened with undisguised attention to a combined lesson in civics and the humanities.

EXUDING confidence based on personal knowledge and official status, Chapin relentlessly hammered away at artificial barriers, distinctly un-American in scope.

"IF AN employer or a labor union has, in the past, discriminated against applicants for jobs or membership on the basis of their race, it is not enough for that employer or union now to stop discriminating. There is an affirmative responsibility to counteract the effect of that previous policy. This does not mean hiring or admitting unqualified applicants. It does mean:

(1) Making it effectively clear that the old policy has been changed; (2) Participating in the preparation and training of people who would have been ready—if it had not been for that discrimination, and (3) Accepting, when they are ready, those who would have been accepted earlier if there had not been a discriminating policy.

We are happy to hear that our national Civil Rights leaders are agreed there will be less stress on marches and demonstrations within the movement in the months ahead. It has been our opinion for a long time that there was too much footwork, and not enough brainwork, going into the struggle for freedom, and that the time was overdue for the demonstrations to come to a screeching halt.

TOO MANY people had gotten into the act and we seriously questioned their motives. Too many were too unprepared and uninformed to assume leadership responsibility and consequently they could not cope with some of the situations that developed, which led to violence and disregard for law and order.

THE EFFECTS of this uncontrolled behavior over-

shadowed the cause and made many of us painfully aware that these publicity seekers became naturals not only for the communists, who never miss an opportunity to infiltrate and to exploit, but also for the bigot to point to as being irresponsible citizens not worthy of the rights afforded other men.

WE HOPE that local Civil Rights leaders will in the future think before they act and stop trying to make headlines.

WE ALSO HOPE that they will purge their rolls of the exploiters, and stop taking everybody that comes along with a story that they want to

Counsellors Fail to Give Information

'Disservice' to Pupils Blasted During Conference on Education

"Counsellors in Logan Heights schools are not acquainting students with thousands of dollars in scholarship funds that are and have been available to them in recent years."

This was the bombshell that James Gilliam, president of San Diego County Teachers' Association, dropped unceremoniously into the laps of some 300 principals and other school functionaries this week at Gompers High School.

The charge came during the American Negro Conference which keynoted stimulation of problem solutions, and challenged the disservice being accorded minority groups in connection with the education of their children. Particularly embarrassing was the stated fact, by repetition, that school funds accrue out of the combined taxes of all property owners.

RELATIVE TO the hot issue of scholarship money, Gilliam stated that \$2 million in scholarship funds are available to bright students, but that bright Negro students seldom were informed of their opportunity to apply for funds.

DR. FRANK TAIT of O'Farrell Junior High, presided at the conference which began Friday. Participants included the Rev. P. H. Gholston, and the Rev. George W. Smith. Panelists were supervised by Ruth Love, and were Opal Jones, Edward Maddox, Arthur J. Williams, James Gilliam and Dumas Robinson.

This battery of stalwarts discussed the gamut of socio-economic problems which confront the Negro and Mexican child in a much-publicized "affluent society." A breakdown of comment revealed that teacher-attitude was often less than desired, and that the curriculum has not occupied itself in telling, through its history books, the overwhelming contribution of Negroes to the commonwealth of the United States.

Undenably, James Gilliam did not pull any punches in his attack in defense of the "citizens of America." He underscored the fact that the conference would not be "another display of pretty words and fraternization."

"IT IS TO BE the beginning of affirmative action to ameliorate conditions that are patently disgraceful and harmful to white and black children alike," said Gilliam. "According to the 1960 U.S.

Tools Change Scene

A few years ago there were no machine tools excepting looms and grist mills which happened to be run by water power. Men had thousands of different tools, some looking quaint to us, but they were manually operated.

Today the measure of a nation's industrial capacity (or potential) is its ability to produce machine tools.

Most of the things in and about our houses and factories were made by machine tools. There are machine tool peoples: Americans, British, French, Belgians, Germans, Swedes, Russians and Japanese. These produce a large part of the tools on which the world's industry is founded and functions.

MANY MACHINE tools, bulky and expensive, are not familiar to us unless we are in industry, and then we know only those we use. Industry divides tools into two main categories: cutting and forming.

MODERN INDUSTRY has the secret of perpetual reproduction in tools, for machine tools must make other machine tools, which then make machine tools or just machines, like automobiles or refrigerators.

The machine tool may be a lathe or a gear-cutter, or it may drill or stamp or press metal or plastics. Advertisements in trade journals show us these ungainly objects by the hundreds, and their type-names only give us a meager

 clue to their uses. They may cost from \$5000 to \$50,000 or more.

This year the United States is producing about \$1.5 billion in tools, about nine-tenths for domestic use. In seven months of this year we have turned out \$588 million in cutting tools, \$252 million in forming tools. This is up about 25 per cent from the same period last year.

THE RICH grow richer and the poor grow poorer in machine tools. The United States and the nations of western Europe are self-sufficient in tools and have a moderate export, because the backward regions are a thin market, being low in cash and industry.

AS WOULD be expected

the Japanese, having reached saturation in machine production (electronics or ships), are now turning to machine tools. In two years they have cut sharply into the European market, and total export is expected to reach \$20 million this year. But Japan has no rivals in the Far East. Here is a vast though scattered market producing almost no machine tools for itself, and the Japanese can easily undersell the West.

For machine tools, the organization of trained technicians, research, raw material supply and markets is an exceedingly slow and complex process, but when any nation can make its own machine tools it is on the way.
