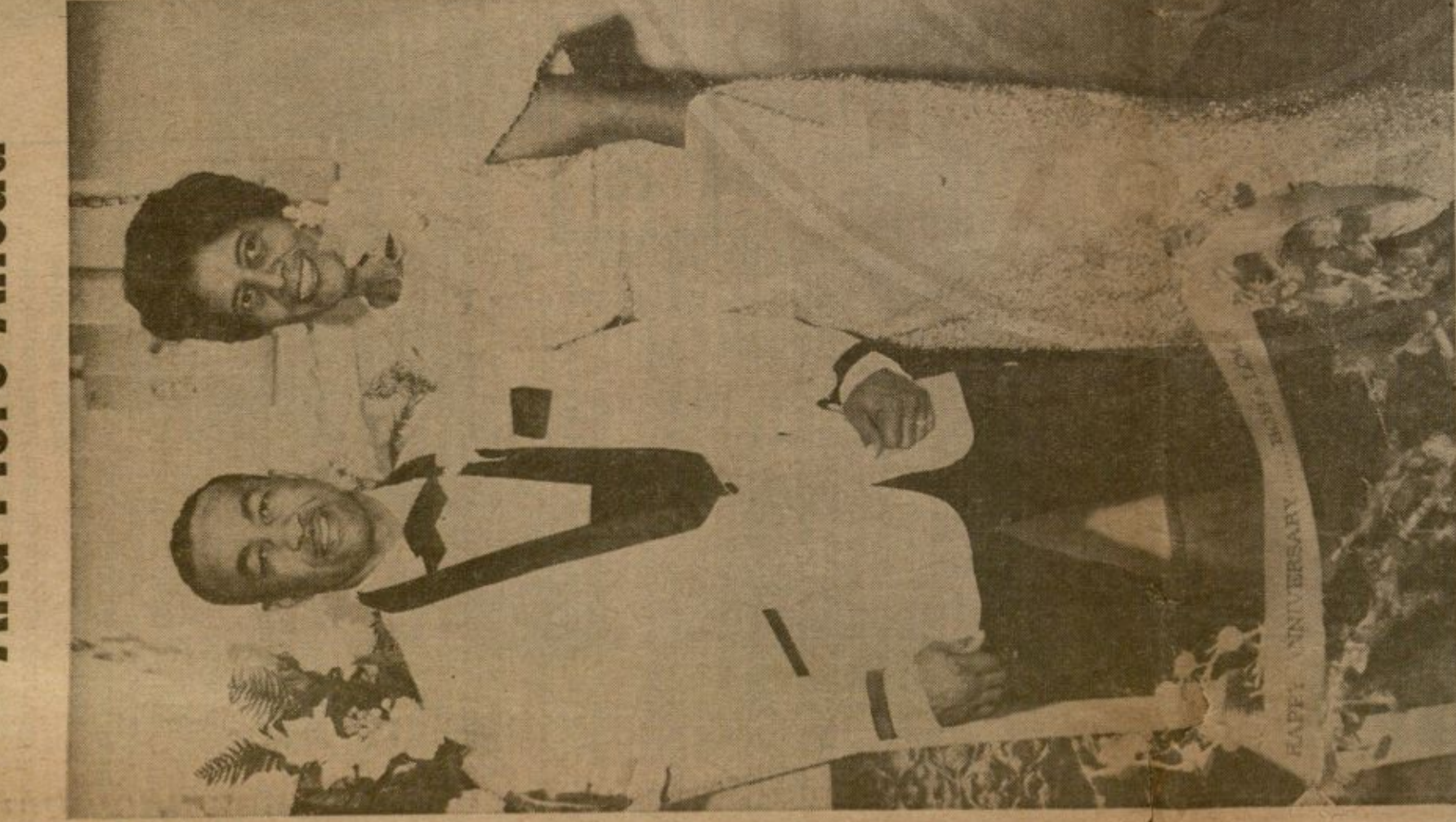
CORE Is Rallying Strength

The San Diego Chapter of the Congress of Racial Equality will hold a large rally meeting this Thursday, December 17th, at 7:30 p.m., at the Southeast Branch YMCA.

The large meeting has been called together by local CORE chairman, Hal Brown, who believes that more Negroes within the Southeast San Diego boundaries should pool their civil rights efforts toward greater economic, employment and political strength.

It is hoped that people from all organizations will attend or send a representative to the meeting.

In explaining the kind of "pooled resources" he expects to draw from, Hal Brown on Monday afternoon told The VOICE Newspaper, "It is time the Negro took the lead in greater participation in support in the Civil Rights Movement. Therefore I strongly urge all Negroes to attend the meeting this Thursday night where I will discuss the results of the Bank of America project and also explain future activities of CORE."

Carey Reports On Xmas Seal Drive For '64

The 38th Annual Christmas Seal Campaign, to raise money to fight tuberculosis and other respiratory diseases in San Diego county, has passed the half-way point, Donald M. Carey, M.D., area chairman, reported yesterday. Thus far 33,000 contributors have given \$87,168.

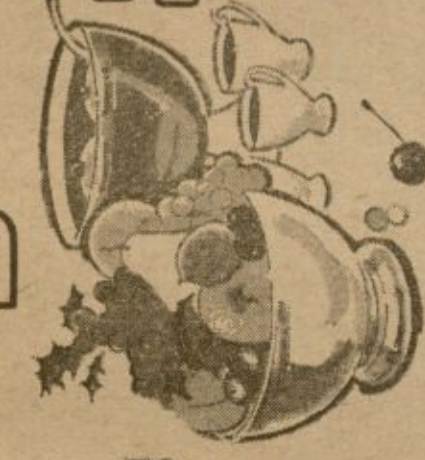
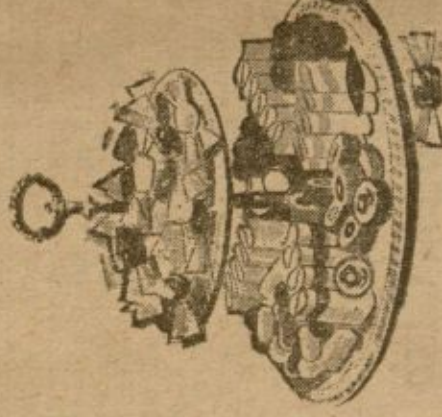

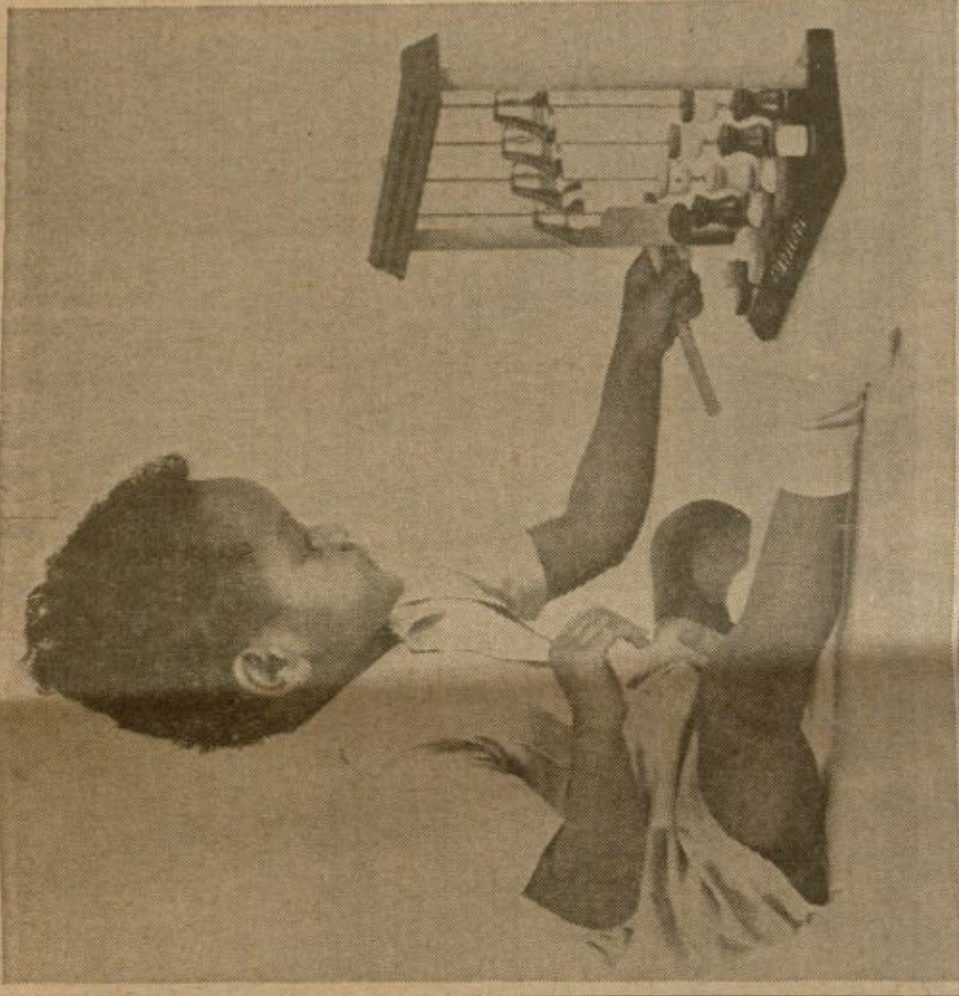

An Editorial: From The Desk of The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee

The Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, J. Edgar Hoover, could spend his time more wisely finding the midnight bombers, arsonists and murderers throughout the South and directing his agents to use their powers under Federal law to make on the spot arrests of Southern policemen who daily deny Negroes their constitutional rights, than in trying to justify the historic failure of the FBI to make any concrete advances in assuring that Southern Negroes can exercise the simplest rights that most Americans take for granted.

The FBI, especially under Hoover, is incapable of performing this task. Such a task would require arresting many of the law enforcement officials with whom the FBI works in the course of their investigations.

For Negroes the FBI has become part of the oppression of the South.

herself against burglaries, the motel manager claimed, she shot Cooke, then called police. That's the way the story goes.

But it is not the only story that is being told—here in the film city and across country. There are other stories being told. This is the one which can be written at this moment.

Seldom in show business annals has there been so much unhypocritical post-mortem expression of shock and regret. "He was such a nice guy—such a decent guy."

That's what they're saying everywhere. Managers, fellow entertainers, columnists, fans. They dug him and they never figured him to go this way.

They figured him to go another route in his show business career. Some would say he had reached his heights. In two years he had cut eight records which sold 10,000,000 copies. He liked good clothes and he liked fine cars. He had seven automobiles and had just ordered a Rolls Royce after closing at New York's top-drawer Copacabana recently.

But he wasn't a fool with his money. He was a good business man. He had his own publishing and recording company, with his records being distributed through RCA Victor. Sam had made. Rumors went about recently that he had collected between \$150,000 and a quarter of a million in a settlement after a dispute over some record earnings. He had a beautiful home here in Hollywood. They wouldn't have to hold any benefits for him.

But Sam didn't figure he had it made yet. He had been leaning more and more to singing bluesy songs, songs which took him back to his sources, to the gospel feeling, the gospel beat, the time when he sang as a kid in a church choir—his father's church in Chicago; the time when he was lead singer with a top gospel group now still flourishing—the Soul-Stirrers.

But death leapt out at him on a Thursday night in a motel in Los Angeles.

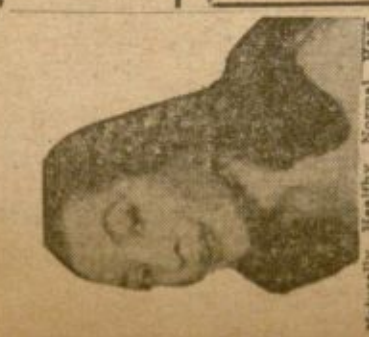
