1	Still frame shot Text: iMovie 08' Jump Start	(Intro Jingle) Narrator: "Welcome to the iMovie 08' Jump Start. Here we go."
2	Still frame shot of entire program interface.	Narrator: There are several amazing things you can do with iMovie 08'. Let's talk about some basics.
3	Zoom into upper left corner of iMovie.	N: First things first, we need some footage to work with. There are several ways to bring footage in to iMovie. Movies can be extracted from a camera, a CD, or may be downloaded from the internet. If we go up to "file", "import to library" We are given the option to chose our source of footage.
4	Focus on import screen.	Before opening iMovie, I put a cd into my CD drive with movie footage on it. When looking at the import screen you will notice that a CD appears on the left side of the window. Here you can select the desired movies and select "import" to bring them directly into iMovie
5	Zoom out and then in to lower left corner of iMovie.	N: Once the footage has completed importing it will show up in the project library on the bottom half of the screen. Now will be a good time to show you where things happen.
6	Still frame shot of entire program interface.	N: The bottom half is the project library, it where all of your imported movies are stored. The very middle of the program's interface is the tool bar. Here you can find useful tools to edit different elements of your program. The top half of the program is split between the working project on the left. This is where you can drag footage to start making a project. On the right is the preview screen. This is where you can preview your video clips.

7	Shot of lower half of the program	<p>N: As mentioned before, the bottom half is where the video footage is stored. The begin working on a project, drag your cursor from a starting point on the footage to a desire ending point. You should see a yellow box appear over the selected footage. Once completed, place your cursor in the center of the yellow box and drag to the top left of imovie NOTE: it should say "drag footage here to create new project." Continue this process for multiple clips if desired.</p>
8	Shot of entire interface, and emphasis placed on middle toolbar.	<p>Assuming we have brought in most or all of our desired footage into a project, we can begin some basic editing steps. Let's talk about adding music, photos, transitions and text. On the very right hand side of the middle toolbar you will notice 4 buttons.</p>
9	Zoom into 4 buttons	<p>First, lets look at adding music. To add music to a project click on the music notes button. When you click the music notes your itunes library will appear. You can use the search function at the bottom indicated by a magnifying glass to find the music selection of choice. Click on the music selection once and press the space bar to preview the song.</p>
10	Zoom out and focus on project in top left.	<p>If satisfied drag the song up to your project. The music will automatically adjust to fit the length of the project.</p>
11	Zoom into 4 buttons	<p>Second, let's add some photos. Similar to adding music, your iphoto and aperture libraries will appear. Navigate through the libraries to find the desired photo.</p>

12	Zoom out and focus on project in top left.	If satisfied drag the photo up to your project.
13	Zoom into 4 buttons	Third, let's add some text. When you click on the "T" button you will be presented with several templates for text.
14	Zoom out and focus on project in top right.	Choose one and drag that template to your project. It can fit before, on top of clips, in between, and after clips. Text formatting options will appear in the preview screen. Here you can type a title, subtitles, and other necessary info.
15	Zoom into 4 buttons	Lastly, let's add some transitions. When you click on the hourglass button, you are presented with several transition options.
16	Zoom out and focus on project in top left.	Choose one and drag that transition before, in between, and after clips in your project.
	Still frame shot of entire program interface.	Assuming this is our finished project. We can share our work with our friends and family. Locate "share" at the top, and select from one of the options. You can save your movie to a media browser, send it to idvd to make professional ready for tv dvds, publish your work to a mobile me gallery, or have your project show up as a movie in itunes, to load to a device like an ipod or an iphone.
