ELIGIBILITY

FOOD AND HOUSING

Students are responsible for the cost of food. London is a culinary mecca and offers an incredible array of gastronomical experiences from four-star dining to tempting take out and regional specialties. Housing for the program is located in the prestigious Kensington neighborhood, close to Hyde Park and Notting Hill. Students will enjoy dorm-style accommodations in a historic building, typically two to a room with spacious meeting areas that are equipped with full kitchens, televisions, and sitting areas.

PROGRAM COSTS

The \$6,375.00 program fee for the basic study program includes:

- College of Extended Studies tuition for 6 units of credit (resident credit—no need to transfer foreign credits for SDSU students)
- Shared accommodations with full kitchens and meeting areas
- London Underground inner city transportation pass
- Special membership in the Imperial College Student Union
- 24-hour access to computer lab
- In-residence wireless internet connection
- Schedule of co-curricular activities
- Insurance
- Services of on-site staff

Not included in the program fee are transportation to London, meals, textbooks, and incidentals.
