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DECLARING THE MAJOR

Requirements—to be met before declaring the major

- 4 required prerequisite courses noted on Major Outline (12 units).
- Minimum grade of “C” in all prerequisites.
- Complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester units.
- Minimum 2.6 G.P.A. cumulative.

Procedures—

At the end of each semester (after grades are posted) CJ pre-majors will be evaluated by the Office of Advising and Evaluations and automatically declared a CJ major if all pre-requisite requirements have been met.

Students who are not automatically declared but have met the minimum pre-requisite requirements may complete the “Declaration or Change of Major” form, which may be obtained from the Lobby of PSFA 100 or from the Office of the Registrar (SSW 1641). Attach an official or unofficial transcript(s) from all institutions of higher education you have attended, or your Degree Evaluation **AND** place in the drop box in PSFA 100. Your transcripts **MUST** show that you have completed all 4 required courses. **BE SURE TO HIGHLIGHT ON YOUR TRANSCRIPTS EVIDENCE OF EACH OF THE FOUR CLASSES TAKEN.** If approved, it is the student’s responsibility to take the form to the Office of the Registrar.

FILING A MASTER PLAN (major outline) (see back)

Students may consult with a CJ Faculty Advisor regarding their course of study within the major. Coursework in the major must conform to the requirements on the Major Outline or Degree Evaluation depending on your catalog year. If courses are not shown on your Degree Evaluation, submit the master plan to your Advisor for formal approval before the end of the second week of your final semester.

If you declared the major in a different catalog year and there is a conflict see your advisor to resolve the conflict.
