

LOWER DIVISION SEMESTER-BY-SEMESTER SUGGESTED PROGRAM

- The University encourages students to enroll in 15 units each semester. However, students should be aware that the College of Business requires a much higher GPA (2.9) to enter upper division than the University does to continue as a student (2.0). Therefore, Business students may wish to consider taking only 12 units the first semester and enrolling in an additional course in summer.
