Beginning with this issue the MONTHLY becomes the Official Journal of THE MATHEMATICAL ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA, and will be subject to the control of the Council of the ASSOCIATION. Thus the MONTHLY enters a broad field of usefulness and is assured of wise and efficient support.

The annual dues in THE MATHEMATICAL ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA have been fixed at THREE DOLLARS, including a yearly subscription to THE AMERICAN MATHEMATICAL MONTHLY, this being the lowest possible figure at which the expenses of the ASSOCIATION can be met on a membership basis of less than one thousand. The MONTHLY alone has actually cost about this amount per subscriber for the last three years, the deficit being provided for by subsidies from fourteen universities and colleges. These subsidies will, of course, no longer be continued.
