## 100 Years ago in The American Mathematical Monthly

In recent years several German professors of mathematics have called public attention to the fact that the number of mathematical students at the various German universities is larger than the probable number of mathematical positions in the German schools. According to the Jahresbericht der Deutschen Mathematiker-Vereinigung, volume 22 (1913), page 369, the number of mathematical students is much smaller during the current year than it has been during recent years. The number of women students of mathematics is, how-ever, still on the increase in the German universities.
