Code" & "Instructions for Preparation of Application for the Donation of Navy Surplus Ships, Boats and Small Landing Craft" re/ Wilson's help in providing information to Mrs. Mitchell's inquiry about using Moth Ball Fleet in San Diego Harbor to help Project Concern in Hong Kong; a letter (4/6/63) from Florence R. Liebhaber (Secretary, Project Concern, Inc., Coronado) to Wilson thanking him for his support; letters (1/30/64) Dr. James W. Turpin & Robert P. Lowell (Harrison & Watson, Attorneys at Law) re/ personal information and updates on actions to help the Montegards in Vietnam by Project Concern.
