A collection of letters, news items, resolutions, statements & legal briefs. **Examples are:** a letter (1/15/62) from James Couller (Indianapolis, IN) to Wilson & attached photocopy of *Daily Worker* (3/13/56) re/ anti-fluoridation and anti-Rockefeller diatribe plus Mr. Couller's anti-liberal bias; office note & letters (9/61-1/62) re/ San Luis Contract, acreage limitations and other issues; a letter (1/22/62) from Mountain Counties Water Resources Assn. to Wilson re/ information to Wilson as to these 10 counties; letter (2/9/62) from Colorado River Board of California to Wilson re/ Frying Pan-Arkansas Project (HR 2206) and San Juan Chama and Navajo Projects (H.R. 7596) information; copy of a letter (2/19/62) from Governor Brown to President Kennedy re/ California water projects and need for federal support; a letter (3/7/62) from Escondido constituent W. M. Porter to Wilson re/ "you are doing a fine job" & commentary on water sources from northwest states to help California; letter & attached resolution (3/62) re/ City of Tustin supports adequate appropriations for San Luis Project; a letter (3/20/62) from the California Farm Research and Legislative Committee to the Honorable Stewart L. Udall re/ their concerns about the long-term negative effects of a public-private utility partnership for the operation of the 2,000 mile transmission line network on the Upper Colorado River Project thus limiting low cost public power; stapled packet of letters (11/61-3/62) re/ responses to La Jolla, Marine Advisers, Inc.'s "Iceberg utilization study;" a letter (4/5/62) from Governor Edmund G. Brown to Wilson and enclosed "copy of letter to President Kennedy from the Governors of the western reclamation states in support of the Bureau of Reclamation budget for the fiscal year of 1963;" letters (3/28 & 4/10/62) re/ Colorado Republican National Committee chairman requests Wilson's support for the Frying Pan-Arkansas Bill; a letter (4/5/62) from a Bureau of Reclamation Commissioner to Wilson and enclosed "copy of the 'General Principles to Govern, and Operating Criteria for Glen Canyon Reservoir (Lake Powell) and Lake Mead During the Lake Powell Filling Period;" a letter (4/20/62) from Coronado constituent Walter F.
