ABOUT KAPPA ALPHA PSI FRATERNITY

Early in this century, because of the formidable obstacles erected to prevent the few Black students who were not dissuaded from attending college to participate in campus co-curricular activities, Byron K. Armstrong and Elder W. Diggs, joined by eight other Black students, formed KAPPA ALPHA PSI FRATERNITY on January 5, 1911. These Founders sought a formula that would raise the sights of Black collegians and stimulate them to accomplishments higher than they might have imagined. Fashioning *achievement* as its purpose, KAPPA ALPHA PSI began uniting college men of culture, patriotism, and honor in a bond of fraternity.

Chapters spread in succession until today the Fraternity has organized chapters on most major college campuses in this country, in all of the major cities, and associations in several areas outside the continental United States. Members of the Fraternity include leaders in all the professions, the military, entertainment media, sports world, and politics.

KAPPA ALPHA PSI promotes a style of intellectual and aesthetic appreciation for more than 50,000 college men. Rooted in a genuine concern for human development, the Kappa gestalt exhorts its members to stretch themselves in all directions while holding fast to sustaining principles of *achievement*.



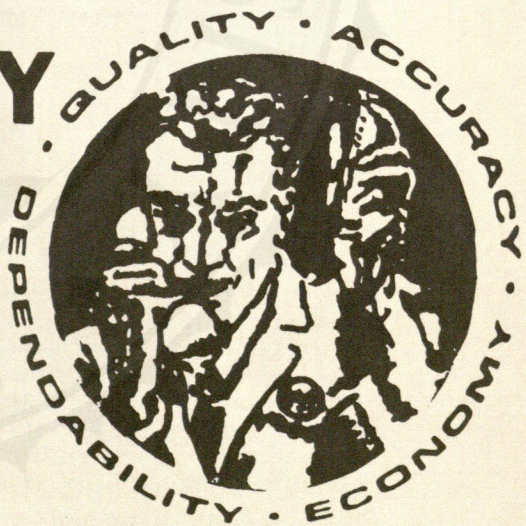

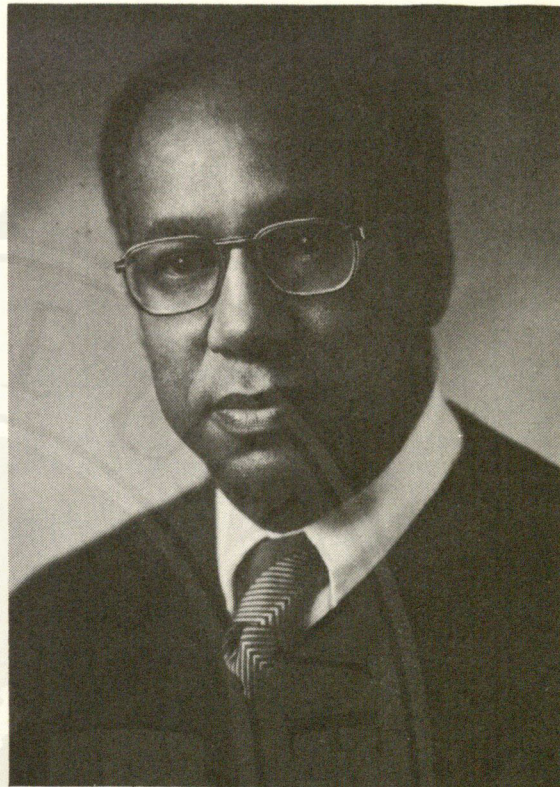

HONORABLE WILEY WILLIAM MANUEL

*Associate Justice
Supreme Court of California*



Judge Manuel was appointed an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of California in March 1977, and thereby became the state's first Associate Justice of Black heritage. Previous to this judicial appointment, Judge Manuel had served as a judge of the Superior Court in Alameda County and had been on the staff of the California Attorney General (San Francisco office) as Deputy Attorney General, Assistant Attorney General, and Chief Assistant Attorney General.

Preparation for Judge Manuel's legal and judicial careers was in California schools—elementary and secondary in Berkeley, the University of California (Berkeley), and Hastings College of Law, where he was Editor-in-Chief of the Hastings Law Journal and was elected to the Coif and Thurston Society.

In spite of Judge Manuel's demanding legal obligations, commitments to a number of professional, civic, and social groups have been maintained. Professionally, he has been associated as a member of the Judicial Council of California, California Conference of Judges, Charles Houston Bar Association of Alameda County (Past President), Hastings College of Trial and Appellate Advocacy (Education), and Board of Trustees for Hastings Law Center (Education). He has authored articles on trends and developments of California Administrative Law. Additionally, Judge Manuel has been a participant in CEB programs on Administrative Mandamus, Practice before Administrative Agencies, and Developments in Administrative Law Practice.

Civic contributions have been made through the Sentencing Advisory Commission to Judicial Council, Governor's Task Force on Consumer Fraud, City of Berkeley Code Review and Study Commission, Oakland Selective Service Board, and Oakland Boy Scouts of America (Chairman, Board of Review and Assistant Scoutmaster).

Judge Manuel's fraternal and social memberships include Knights of Columbus (lecturer, Advocate, and Grand Knight), Rooney (Serra) Assembly, Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, and University of California and Hastings College of Law Alumni associations.

Honors paid Judge Manuel for his professional and public service include citations from the Black American Law Students Association with the William Hastie Award; Award of Recognition from the John M. Langston Bar Association, Los Angeles; Merit Award, Citizen of the Year 1977, *Sun Reporter*; Pioneer in Black Legal Leadership Award, 1979, Brotherhood Crusade; Jurist of the Year Award, National Bar Association, 1980. Judge Manuel received the LL.D degree from the University of San Diego School of Law in 1978.

Judge and Mrs. Manuel (the former Eleanor M. Williams) are the parents of two children, a daughter—Yvonne Anne Temple, and a son—Gary C. Manuel.

**HONORABLE
EARL B. GILLIAM**
*Judge of the Superior Court
San Diego County*



While Judge Gilliam is a New Mexico native and attended Oklahoma City Schools for the primary grades, California schools have been the setting for the remainder of his formal education. The three levels of public schooling were completed in San Diego City Schools, and the B.A. degree was received at San Diego State University in 1953 (Business Administration major). Judge Gilliam received the LLB and JD degrees from Hastings College of Law and also did graduate work in accounting at San Francisco State University.

Following his admission to the California Bar, he was a Deputy District Attorney for San Diego County (1957-61) and engaged in the private practice of law prior to his appointment as a Municipal Court judge in 1963; he was named to the Superior Court in 1975, and nominated to the Federal bench recently. Judge Gilliam has had teaching and lecturing positions with Western States College of Law, United States International University, University of California at San Diego, and for the last four years, has conducted a lecture series for new attorneys in Court and Defenders' programs.

Numerous civic affiliations were and are currently maintained by Judge Gilliam. He is on the Board of Directors for the San Diego Urban League, Navy League, and Boys' Club. Additionally, he has served with the Board of Overseers, University of California at San Diego; Board of Trustees, Western States College of Law and its Scholarship Committee. Public service in the past has been rendered, in various capacities, to the Salvation Army, YMCA, Model Cities, Buckhaven Home for Girls, Aztec Alumni Association (San Diego State University), 200th Anniversary of the City of San Diego, and the NAACP. Other civic responsibilities were as a member of the Board of Visitors of Hastings College of Law, the Committee to Organize Public Defenders for the County of San Diego, and San Diego Board of Education advisory committee on equal education.

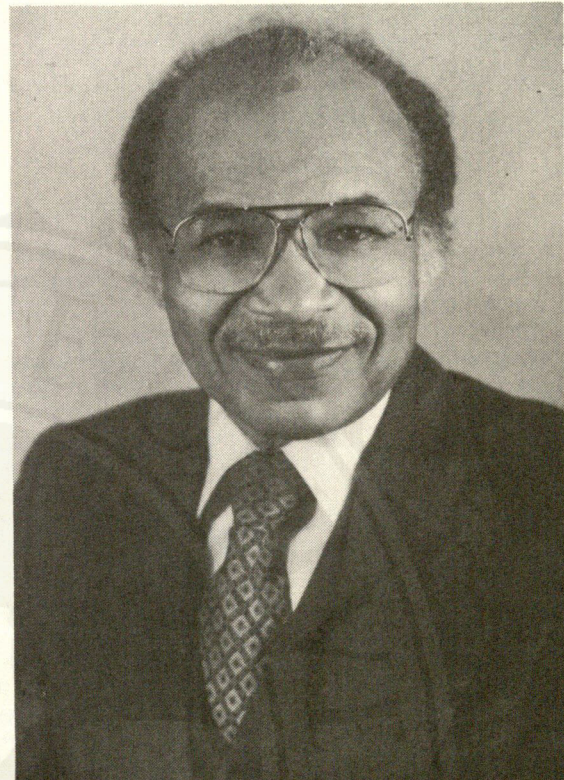
Awards include: San Diego Junior Chamber of Commerce's selection as Young Man of the Year (1965); Commissioner General for the Month of March, City of San Diego's 200th Anniversary; Good Guy for San Diego (1974); and San Diego's Citizen of the Year (1973).

Judge Gilliam became a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity when he was initiated a charter member of Delta Epsilon Chapter at San Diego State University; other undergraduate academic and subject area organizations were Tau Sigma and Sigma Beta Tau. He was a member of Pi Alpha Delta, national legal fraternity. He is now a member of Alpha Pi Boule.

Judge Gilliam is the father of two sons, ages 17 and 23.

**HONORABLE
ALPHA L. MONTGOMERY**

*Judge of the Superior Court
San Diego County*



Alpha L. Montgomery received his BA Degree from Fisk University and his JD Degree from Howard Law School in Washington, D.C. He was admitted to the California State Bar in 1948 and began general practice of law in San Diego in 1949.

Before residing in California, he was employed by the federal government in Washington, D.C., where he received the "Superior Accomplishment Award" for his work as an economist.

He is the author of several papers and booklets in the field of economics and politics. He assisted in the preparation of the Report of Racial Isolation in Public Schools in the United States, published by the United States Commission on Civil Rights. He has been a guest lecturer at the University of San Diego.

His community activities have included the following memberships: Forum of American Freedoms; Interview Board of San Diego Civil Service Commission; Board of Architectural Review for City of San Diego; San Diego Urban League; Governor's Commission on Rumford Act and Moral Guidelines Implementation Committee for State Board of Education.

He has served as an Arbitrator on the National Panel of Arbitrators for the American Arbitration Association and served as a member of the California Advisory Committee to the United States Commission on Civil Rights.

He was invited to Washington by President Eisenhower to participate in the "Conference For President's Commission on Equal Employment Opportunity" and invited by President Kennedy to the "Regional Conference Of Community Leaders On Equal Employment Opportunity." President Johnson invited him to the 1966 "White House Conference on Civil Rights."

Judge Montgomery received a Certificate of Service from the San Diego County Bar Association for his work as a Federal Court Defender. He has a Certificate of Appreciation from the City of San Diego for his service to the City, and has received a Certificate of Expression of Appreciation for his work with the State Bar of California.

His hobbies include snow and water skiing. He and his wife, Ann, and their twin sons, reside in La Mesa, California.

Judge Montgomery is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity.

**HONORABLE
NAPOLEON A. JONES, JR.**

*Judge of the Municipal Court
San Diego Judicial District*



A native of Louisiana, Judge Jones is a product of the San Diego City School system, and is twice a graduate of San Diego State University: AB degree in Social Welfare and Masters of Social Work. As an undergraduate, he was a varsity wrestler, member of the Oceotal Honorary Service Organization, Inter-Fraternity Council, Social Action Committee, and Black Students Council. He was initiated into Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity during his undergraduate years. Undergraduate academic training was followed by work in the human services field prior to embarking on a career in law.

Judge Jones has served in the Department of Adult Parole and Community Service, and Public Welfare departments in San Diego and Santa Clara counties. While a law student, experience was gained as a Student Assistant in the Juvenile Court for Defenders, Inc., legal services coordinator for Community Crises Center, and as a legal intern for the California Rural Assistance (Modesto).

The JD degree was received in June, 1971 from the University of San Diego School of Law, where Judge Jones graduated in the top quarter of the class. Legal practice followed as a staff attorney for the California Rural Legal Assistance (Modesto), Defenders, Inc. (San Diego), and private practice. Jones & Adler.

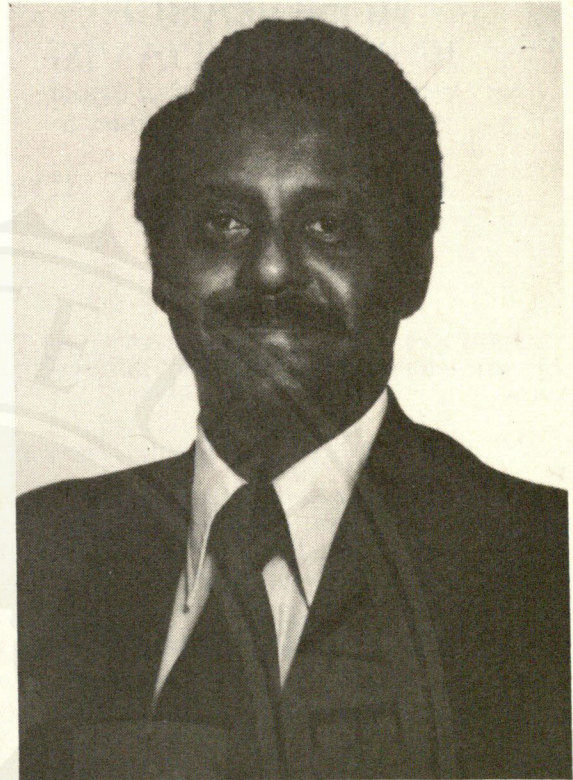
While a law student, Judge Jones was a recipient of the Minority Group Scholarship, Grantt-Richardson Award, Outstanding Student of Juvenile Law, Book Award for Outstanding Achievement in Labor Law, recipient of the Reginald Huber Smith Fellowship, and was listed in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities. He was selected as Distinguished Alumni, School of Social Work Merit, and has been a member of San Diego Review (Associate Editor).

Professional and community affiliations have been: board of directors, Community Crisis Center; president, Black American Law Students Association; board of directors, NAACP; chairman, Modesto Black Caucus; board of directors, San Diego Black Federation; Mt. View Park Advisory Committee; board of directors, Ebonees House; chairperson, San Diego Association of Black Attorneys; Criminal Defense Lawyers Club; and Board of Directors, Tradition One—Alcohol Treatment Program.

Judge Jones currently serves on the board of directors, San Diego State University Alumni Association, Law in a Free Society, and Black Communication Center. He is chairperson, Citizens Advisory Committee, Fourth Councilmanic District; member, California Judges Association; California and San Diego Black Attorneys Associations; San Diego Integration Task Force; and Indigent Defense Policy Board. He is a faculty member of Continuing Judicial Studies Program. Judge Jones has written for the San Diego Law Review: "To Plea or Not to Plea: The Question Posed by Federal Rule II."

Judge Jones has two children—11 and 7.

Riverside Counties*

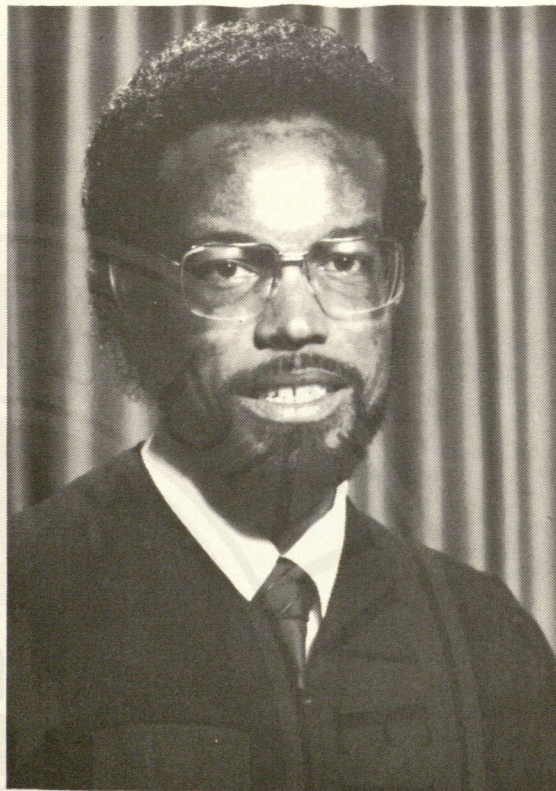


Judge Floyd came to Southern California after receiving a BA degree from New York University. Professional experiences, other than legal, were had as Administrative Assistant, San Diego County Chief Administrative Office,* and San Diego City Planning Commission. The JD degree was granted by the University of San Diego School of Law,* followed by experience as Deputy City Attorney,* Adjunct Professor of Constitutional Law, and Professor of Urban Law. (*First Afro-American).

Other than position-related responsibilities, Judge Floyd has been a delegate to State bar Convention, a board of directors member for Legal Aid society, Girls Club, and a former member of the Attorney General's Consumer Task Force.

*Judge of the Municipal Court
San Diego Judicial District*



Joseph Kenneth Davis is a native San Diegan, born in the last of four children to Harvey and Brazill Davis.

He is a product of San Diego City Schools, having attended Chesterton and Emerson Elementary Schools, Memorial Jr. High School and San Diego High School - graduating in 1964.

Judge Davis graduated from San Diego State University in 1969 with a B.A. in Psychology and received his Juris Doctor degree from the UCLA School of Law in 1972.

In 1973 Joseph Davis worked briefly with Legal Aid Society of San Diego, Inc. He became a Deputy City Attorney later in 1973 in the Criminal Division of the office of the City Attorney. In 1976 he was elevated to the Civil Division. In 1977 Joseph Davis returned to the Legal Aid Society as the Supervising Attorney of the Southeast Office, wherein he supervised the workloads of eight attorneys and fifteen support staff, remaining there until his recent judicial appointment.

His activities and accomplishments have been many during the past several years. He is presently a Business Law Instructor for the San Diego Community College District, and serves on the Board of Directors of Black Federation and Community Crisis Center. He is a past President of the Association of Black Attorneys of San Diego County, and is the current district chairman of the Aequus District of Boy Scouts of America. He also serves currently on the Bar Association's Ad Hoc Committee on Affiliate Status, and was an ex-officio member and legal advisor to the San Diego Community Relations Board for the City. He was a Delegate to the State Bar Convention in 1976, 1977, 1978 and served also at that time as co-chairman of the San Diego County Bar Association's Subcommittee on Criminal Legislation. He achieved Dean's List honors at San Diego State University in 1969. He was on the Bar Association's Ad Hoc Committee of the California Bar Examination and is a current member of the judicial section of the California Association of Black Lawyers.

Judge Davis and his wife Alyce, are the proud parents of two sons, Kenny and Milan.

Judge Elizabeth Riggs was born in Camden, New Jersey. The B.A. degree was received with honors from Bennett College, Greensboro, North Carolina, in 1963, where she was active in the Civil Rights movement. Returning to her hometown, Judge Riggs taught high school dropouts and began the first Head Start program and Neighborhood Youth Corps in Camden.

In 1970, Judge Riggs enrolled in Rutgers University School of Law from which she received the JD degree in 1973. As a law school student, she served as secretary of the Black American Law Student Association, member of the Committee on Disruptions, and was a Senate Representative. the Committee on Disruptions.

Judge Riggs was admitted to the California Bar in 1974. Prior to her judicial appointment, Judge Riggs was employed by the Rural Legal Assistance, San Diego District Attorney, and Office of the Attorney General. She has been active in numerous law associations and community groups, including the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Judge Riggs is listed in the Who's Who of Black Americans and the Who's Who Among Outstanding Young Women.

Judge Riggs is married and has three children.
