PROPOSED NEW, EXPANDED OR REVISED MAGNET PROGRAMS - 1979-80

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Site steering committees for both the elementary and secondary magnet programs have been meeting regularly since September to plan new and expanded program opportunities for 1979-80. The following are tentative proposals:

NEW PROGRAMS

1. Laboratory School Magnets - Baker Elementary and Sunset View Elementary. It is proposed that two additional laboratory or model school magnets, in conjunction with Point Loma College, be developed for implementation in the 1979-80 school year. Administrators, parents and staff members at both elementary schools have been involved in discussions relative to the establishment of magnet school programs. The administration of Point Loma College is interested in participating and supporting the district integration program.

(Grade levels for September 1979, K-6.)

Estimated Cost for 1979-80: Baker - \$265,654; Sunset View - \$225,549

2. Academic Academy Magnet - Johnson Elementary. It is proposed that a magnet school program be developed and implemented at Johnson for the 1979-80 school year. The concept of the academic academy is to provide a traditional basic skills instructional program based upon six years of research by the Far West Regional Laboratory. Through intensive staff development and pupil monitoring procedures, time-on-task techniques will be implemented in each classroom to increase the academic learning of all pupils enrolled in the magnet school. The techniques include sufficient pupil learning time devoted to each identified objective, classroom organization and teaching practices that ensure pupil attention to the task, and individual and group activities designed to promote high rates of pupil success. The magnet concept has been developed by parents, teachers and district administrators who have been meeting on a regular basis.

(Grade levels for September 1979, K-6.)

Estimated Costs for 1979-80: Johnson - \$191,000

EXPANDED PROGRAMS

1. Olympics School Magnet - Fulton Elementary and Green Elementary. A central steering committee formed last year has been expanded to include representatives from such organizations as the Amateur Athletic Union, the San Diego Padres, the San Diego Chargers, and the Park and Recreation Department of the City of San Diego. This is in addition to parents, teachers, and district administrators. Site committees have also been formed at both Fulton and Green. As originally conceived, the Olympics Magnets were designed to operate as a program within the school at grades 4-6. It is proposed that the program operate as a total school magnet at grades 1-6.

(Grade levels for September 1979, 1-6.)

Estimated additional costs for 1979-80: Fulton - \$31,000; Green - \$31,000

Proposed New, Expanded or Revised Magnet Programs - 1979-80

2. Bilingual Magnet (Spanish) - Lowell Elementary. As originally planned, the Lowell Bilingual Magnet accepted students in grades 1 and 2 for this year, with the addition of grade 3 in 1979-80, grade 4 in 1980-81 and grade 5 in 1981-82. Student recruitment for this program has been hampered by the grade level limitations, especially for parents having older siblings of elementary school age. It is proposed that the original grade level implementation be revised to include grades 1-6 for the 1979-80 school year.

(Grade levels for September 1979, 1-6.)

Estimated additional costs for 1979-80: Lowell - no increase

REVISED PROGRAM

1. Intercultural Language Magnet (French) - Knox Elementary. As originally planned, a French Intercultural Language Magnet was to be implemented at Freese Elementary for the 1979-80 school year. It has become apparent that the lack of freeway accessibility and a subsequent lengthy bus ride to Freese will hamper the recruitment of students for the magnet program. It is therefore proposed that Knox Elementary be designated as the location of the French Intercultural Magnet Program. Knox is easily accessible from the 805 Freeway and other major traffic arteries, as well as having sufficient space to house the magnet program in the 1979-80 school year. The proposed change has been discussed with the Knox staff and parent leaders at the school. Both the staff and P.T.A. are supportive of the program.

(Grade levels for September 1979, K-1.)

Estimated additional costs for 1979-80: Knox - no increase

OTHER INTEGRATION PROGRAMS

1. Indochinese Center (Vietnamese, Laotian) - Beale Elementary. The Beale Indochinese Center provides primary language instruction for students whose home language is either Vietnamese or Laotian. Provisions are made for intensive instruction in English as a Second Language and basic skills instruction in the native tongue of the student. Students are transported from other school communities to Beale on a daily basis.

(Grade levels for September 1979, K-6.)

Estimated costs for 1979-80: Beale - \$45,000

PROPOSED NEW AND EXPANDED MAGNET PROGRAMS - 1979/80

SECONDARY SCHOOLS

NEW PROGRAMS

1. Creative and Performing Arts - Roosevelt. Tentative plans have been developed to implement this magnet at secondary level in February, 1979, for approximately sixty (60) 7th grade students on a full time basis. Plans for September, 1979, will add 8th and 9th grade students on a full time basis and possibly involvement for some 10th through 12th grade students.

(Grade levels for September 1979--7-9, limited 10-12)

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$157,000

2. Science/Math/Health Careers - Lincoln. The site steering committee has been meeting monthly to plan this new magnet for September, 1979. Subcommittees working on facility, equipment and instructional needs have been involved also. Present plans call for starting 9th and 10th grade students on the Gompers site, with 11th and 12th grade students at Lincoln.

(Grade levels for September 1979--11-12)

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$650,000

3. Fundamental School Mirror Magnet - (Site to be determined). It is proposed that a second Fundamental School program should be established for September, 1979. This new program site should be placed at a secondary school outside of the court defined 23 minority-isolated schools. The intent of this mirror magnet would be to receive minority student graduates from the 6th grade program as well as minority students from the minority-isolated schools. Resident students would also be eligible. O'Farrell would continue to serve the majority student graduates from the 6th grade Fundamental program, O'Farrell residents, and other interested majority students.

(Grade level for September 1979--7-8)

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$ 70,000

4. Primary Language Regional Centers. As our school district meets the Lau compliances, we may want to consider including the primary language regional centers as a part of our total integration plan. Regional centers are being considered as follows:

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$125,000

NEW PROGRAMS (Continued)

5. Center for Marketing, Business Occupations - San Diego High School.
The content would emphasize Marketing, Business Management, and Business Occupations and the program would complement the present center at Mission Bay. A working relationship with the Chamber and downtown businesses will be an integral part of this center. With the eventual development of the Intercultural Language Program at San Diego High School, international trade and relations could also become a part of this center. In the future, San Diego High School would include:

Performing and Creative Arts
Intercultural Language Program
Center for Marketing, Business Occupations

(Grade levels for September 1979--10-12)

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$ 69,000

6. Other Considerations. Other concepts being studied at present for inclusion into integration planning are:

Junior High School Gifted Seminars (7-9)
Military Science Centers (9-12)
Marching Band Center (7-12)

Estimates will be forthcoming.

EXPANDED PROGRAMS

1. Bilingual Program - Collier. The site steering committee has been meeting bi-monthly for this magnet. Current plans propose the addition of thirty (30) students in September 1979. The steering committee is recommending that the present group of 7th and 8th grade students be continued and a new 7th grade section started in September. No new 9th grade students would be added unless the language skills are adequate for enrollment in the second-year group.

(Grade levels for September 1979--7-8, plus those present 8th graders who will be in 9th)

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$28,000

2. Bilingual Program - Point Loma. The site steering committee has been meeting monthly. Current plans propose the addition of thirty (30) 10th grade students in September 1979. The program would then have two groups next year, the present one continuing into the 11th grade and a new section of 10th grade students in September. No new 11th grade students would be added unless the language skills are adequate for enrollment in the second-year group.

(Grade levels for September 1979--10-11)

Additional estimated 79-80 costs: \$28,000

3. Intercultural Language Magnet - Memorial. The site steering committee has been meeting monthly for this magnet. Proposed plans for September 1979 are to continue the present group into the 8th grade and start a new section of 7th grade students. Recruitment will be concentrated primarily on present 6th grade participants in the Intercultural Language Program; however, other incoming 7th grade students who are interested will be invited.

(Grade levels for September 1979--7-8)

No additional costs, 79-80.

EXPANDED PROGRAMS (Continued)

4. Fundamental School Magnet - O'Farrell. The site steering committee has met on a monthly basis this year. It has been recommended by the steering committee that additional 7th grade students be enrolled in February 1979. No additional staffing is needed to implement this group. For September 1979 it is proposed that the program be available to interested 7th through 9th grade students.

(Grade levels for September 1979--7-9)

No additional costs, 79-80.

5. Science/Math/Computers Magnet - Gompers. The site steering committee and subcommittees have been meeting frequently for this magnet. Present plans propose expanding the program to include 7th through 11th grade students in September 1979. This would provide continuity for the current 6th grade students involved in science/math centers, as well as other incoming 7th grade students from throughout the district.

(Grade levels for September 1979--7-11)

No additional costs, 79-80.
