Brief Explanation:

On April 4, 1983, the Board of Education approved the phasing out of all but one of the Specialized Learning Center Programs for the 1983-84 school year. The remaining learning center, at Freese Elementary School, will operate on a revised schedule during the first semester of 1983-84 and will serve as a transition to the Old Town Historical/Cultural Program for fourth-grade students, 1984-85.

Fourth-grade students from selected elementary schools are eligible to participate in 1983-84. Schools designated include 7 minority-isolated schools and 19 predominantly majority schools. See Attachment 1.


Each participating school is scheduled for one week's time beginning October 3, 1983. See Attachment 2.

Curricular offerings include an intensive one-week experience in music and art as well as continued instruction in basic skills and counseling opportunities. A transitional theme in preparation for the Old Town Historical/Cultural Program will be used.

During the second semester the learning center staff will be used to reinforce the balanced curriculum concept by providing resource assistance to the minority-isolated schools and the naturally integrated schools. They will also assist in the development of the Old Town Historical/Cultural Program and the expanded Balboa Park Program.
