assists other Kurdish refugees with translation,
transportation, orientation, etc.
Hunar is a real asset to the Kurdish Community

2. Guta Basner: Russian

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
assists Jewish Family Services with fundraising & holiday
refugee parties
member of the east county Jewish Community Center
Assists refugees with transportation, emergency services &
translation
Came to USA as single parent, worked several part-time jobs
to support her family. Now has a full-time job as office
manager. Started an editorial in Russian language news-
paper. This Russian paper is now sold in other states.

3. Gugsu Mokennen: Oromo

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
Actively volunteers assisting the Oromo community with
translation, transportation, orientation, etc. He has
been very generous with his time to his community.
He is a businessman, makes available space for the Oromo
community members to meet and hold cultural activities.
He assists the Oromo community members by educating them

Asad arrived in 1992 and got employed right away as assistant

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
Member of East County Jewish Community Center
Donates his time as cinematographer to video events in the community
Gersh arrived from Kiev about four years ago. He is a well known cinematographer. He came with almost no English skills but a motivation and desire to become proficient in his new language and gainfully employed. Although 50+ years is successful in both these goals. He now has a job with the San Diego Museum of Art. His job is as a guide & security guard.
Gersh helps fellow new arrivals as a volunteer

6. Walter Lam: Ugandan

Self-Sufficient, economically & socially
Does public speaking regarding refugees
Member of Amnesty International & Peacemakers (Presbyterian)
Member & founder of "Alliance For African Assistance"
Assist by volunteering for members of his community in translation, transportation, emergency needs, orientation, etc.
Established "Safari Seconds" a thrift store in North Park which helps all refugees and the community as a whole in North Park.

7. Xanh Lam: Vietnamese

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
social activities: Karaoke, Ballroom Dancing
Member: PTA, ESL Institute
Assist with Vietnamese New Year Celebration, workshop presenter
Volunteers time to help other with translation, transportation, orientation, etc.
Currently full-time contract ESL instructor at North City Center - Kearny Campus.

8. Zue Thao: Hmong

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
Social Activity: Hmong Youth Association & Lao-Hmong Association
Zue was born in 1955 in Laos. He spent five years in a re-education camp
Came to the US in 1982. Worked as an instructional aide for the San Diego Community College, as a Health Educator & translator for U.C. Medical Center. Also worked as a casemanager with

Catholic Charities for several years. He continually took courses in Electronics, welding, computer programming, auto mechanics. He has been employed in the electronics industry for the past six years. He has a wife and six children.

9. Toan Humphrey: Vietnamese

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
Offered a workshop at an ESL conference instructing on the problems & strategies in teaching Vietnamese students
She is currently employed as a ESL instructor at the San Diego Community College District since 1991 and most recently was awarded an ESL contract, making her an assistant professor. She has been teaching ESL to adults since 9/88. She has earned a B.A. in business. Early on she supplemented her income by working weekends as a waitress, cleaned homes and was an assembler in a noodle factory and yet volunteered her time with the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program. These were beginnings.

10. Onekeo Kounnavong: Lao


Self-sufficient, economically & socially

His wife has done power machine work in their home and attends school at night. They have three children and all have won various awards at the La Mesa Dale School in La Mesa.

11. Nguyen Minh Hoang: Vietnamese

Self-sufficient, economically & socially
Has volunteered for his community as translator, orientor and transportation.
He currently works as a Production Manager for Distributed, Inc.
He arrived in the U.S. in 1992. He went to work early on and since has assisted by hiring other refugees to work

in his production line. Over 30 refugees have been hired in the last six months. He assists new employees by setting up transportation, providing translation.

A Quarter of a Century - Focused and Committed

San Ysidro Health Center, Inc. began operating out of a small house in 1969 as an outreach effort of the University of California San Diego School of Medicine. Office of Economic Opportunity funding was obtained in 1970; the original Clinic was built in 1972. In 1974 the Center incorporated as a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization. This community health center receives Federal funds under section 330 of the Public Health Service Act and as such is governed by a consumer dominated Board of Directors representing the ethnically diverse population it serves. The governing body's officers are all Center patients and six professional board members provide expertise in health, law, education, government and business. With over 300 employees and three satellite clinic sites, the Center is a major employer in the South Bay area of San Diego County as well as a community service provider.

The original 11,400 square foot clinic soon proved inadequate. Rapid growth forced some of the Center services to be housed in trailers and nearby offices. A Hill-Burton grant funded a 30,500 square foot addition in 1976. In addition, a new facility for Mental Health was completed in 1980. Today, San Ysidro Health Center services include: medical, dental, health education, optometry, behavioral health, community nursing, medical social services, nutrition counseling, lab, radiology and pharmacy. The Center receives funding for special programs and services such as comprehensive perinatal services (CPSP), WIC (Women, Infants & Children), County Medical Services, adolescent health, AIDS education and outreach, geriatric care and binational tuberculosis control. The Center participates with local universities and colleges in health professional training activities.

In 1982, San Ysidro Health Center created Community Health Group (CHG), a Knox-Keene 501(c)(4) licensed Health Maintenance Organization (HMO). This separate corporation contracts for the delivery of prepaid health services to the medically indigent, culturally diverse population of the County, all of whom are MediCal patients. By January of 1983, CHG was named the regional contractor for the County Medical Services Program with the responsibility for both in- and out-patient services and had obtained contracts with two primary care sites and three hospitals. The State of California, Department of Health Services awarded its first contract for a Primary Care Case Management Program (PCCM) to CHG in 1984. In 1986, CHG received the State Department of Corporations HMO license and converted the PCCM program into a full Prepaid Health Plan (PHP) for the South Bay area of San Diego County. Expanded service to both the central and western portions of the County was accomplished in 1992 and in 1994, North County was added with Department of Corporations (DOC) approval. Total PHP enrollment is now 40,000 with 100 primary care sites and 23 hospitals under contract.

SYHC incorporated the National City Family Clinic in 1982; the Downtown Mental Health site in 1985, and in the following year the Chula Vista Family Clinic. The San Diego Community Medical Clinic began providing services in 1989 and, three years later in 1992, both the Chula Vista Specialty Clinic (providing cardiology and OB/GYN services) and the greatly expanded San Diego Community Medical Clinic opened under the San Ysidro

Health Center, Inc. umbrella. During this time, the Primary Care Case Management program was reactivated and began servicing MediCal beneficiaries enrolled with other community health centers and private medical groups in several sites countywide.


Behavioral Health Group (BHG) the mental health division of SYHC now operates day treatment programs for adolescents in the northern and eastern San Diego County and a nationally acclaimed psychiatric case management program for the homeless in downtown San Diego. A woman's outpatient recovery center for substance abusing females was opened in April 1992. Behavioral Health Group also provides psychiatric case management services for Community Health Group's prepaid health plan members.

The total population of the San Ysidro Health Center service area is approximately 316,000 persons (1990 census). Of the 36,925 users of SYHC, Inc. in 1993, 32,736 or 89% were minorities with 27,649 (75%) at or below the poverty level. This area contains a high proportion of minority residents, with the largest representation being Hispanic. The percentage of the population with income at or below poverty level typically reflects the proportion of minority residents. To date, statistics show that 70% of SYHC, Inc. clients are on Medi-Cal, Medicare or County Medical Services (CMS). Seventy seven per cent of the patients seen were females and 12,416 were children under the age of twelve. Federal funding originally represented about 80% of the Health Center's budget; that figure has now decreased to less than 10% according to 1992 audited financial statements and year to date financials.

Starting on the Next 25 Years

For the future, the Center is exploring expansion to commercial lines of business, development of a certified family practice residency program and expansion of clinic size. As healthcare in this country moves toward managed care, San Ysidro Health Center is positioned for this eventuality as a result of our experience with our own HMO, Community Health Group. The Center continues to operate in a recessionary economic climate in which the needs of the service area population are increasing while the resources available to meet those needs are decreasing. Even so, San Ysidro Health Center continues to be firmly committed to meeting the needs of the service area population through the provision of affordable healthcare services which are medically appropriate and delivered in a culturally, linguistically and educationally sensitive manner.
